

Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries Apple Establishment Budget Hon. John Savage, Minister Central Leader 202 Fall 1989

Introduction

This budget estimates the direct income and expenses to establish one acre of apples on the Central Leader production system planted at a density of 382 trees/acre (2.3m x 4.5 m spacing). Tree spacing depends on soil type, rootstock, variety vigor, and training system.

These numbers are intended to assist producers in evaluating the financial requirements of the establishment period. A total farm financial analysis should be completed in order to determine the impact of a new planting on the total orchard business. A complete set of planning forms are available from any BCMAF district office.

Price Sensitivity

The following table shows the impact on gross margin resulting from a change in projected market returns. (bold denotes target values)

Market return is the most significant variable in assessing profit in establishing and producing apples. Price alters the budget's projected gross margins. It is important to obtain as much information on potential market returns when developing a budget for your own situation. Quality, size, strain, and variety are just some factors to consider.

Production Sensitivity

Level- The table below shows the results of a 10% and 20% reduction in target production levels on per acre gross margins (@ \$0.12/lb).

Timing- Projected margins are also affected by how soon young trees come into production. The table below summarizes the impacts of delaying target production by 1 and 2 years.

These margins demonstrate the importance of obtaining early production on intensive plantings. Projected yields and timing are affected by tree quality, management, location, and weather.
