Fighting Forest Fires in British Columbia

As the forest industry is the province's number one source of revenue, it is imperative that Brit-

ish Columbia maintain a directed and efficient fire control program. We are proud to operate at a 94% success rate, meaning that 94% of all fires are contained to less than 4 hectares within 24 hours of detection. During peak fire season, we maintain a full-time fire sup-



pression staff of approximately 800 professionally trained firefighters, 12 fixed-wing aircraft, and 18 helicopters. In addition, a core of approximately 250 research and operations personnel are responsible for the on-going development of the program. British Columbia forest fire management expertise is a result of close to 90 years of ongoing development; a fact which many foreign governments have recognized in the development of their own programs.



International Cooperation

In light of the increasing emphasis on environmental concerns within the forest industry, and the recognition of the need to be prepared for forest fires, international cooperation in forest protection is becoming more important. With the rise in international activity, the British Columbia Forest Service, Protection Program has made it a priority to share its firefighting experience with countries around the world. The goal is to assist other agencies create the most cost efficient and operationally effective program possible in the context of their fire control and prevention requirements.

Over the past several years, the British Columbia Forest Service, Protection Program has been fortunate to work with agencies around the world, working to improve their fire fighting capabilities while providing valuable contributions to different cultural, social, and political environments.
