

Want information about British Columbia streams and lakes and the fish in them?

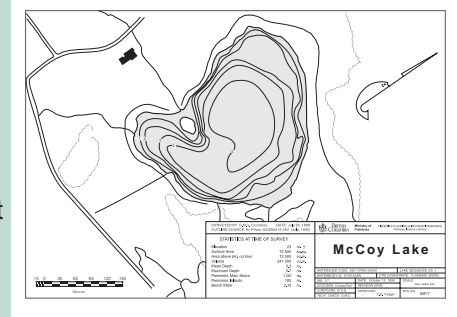
Check out available fisheries information at www.gov.bc.ca/srm and click on Fisheries Inventory, or go to www.fishwizard.com.

You can ask the FishWizard for detailed maps and information about streams and lakes anywhere in the province. You can even find out what fisheries projects are going on in your local watersheds from the Fisheries Project Registry.

Dig a little deeper into the Fisheries Inventory section of the web site and find even more information in the federal/provincial Fisheries Information Summary System and the provincial Fisheries Data Warehouse.

Ask the FishWizard

The FishWizard is a simple, map-based Internet tool for finding and viewing the most recent information from online government data sets. The FishWizard will lead you through a sequence of steps to get the information you want. First select a lake or stream or broader area you are interested in, then select the information you would like to see. You get detailed maps of watersheds, stream networks and lakes from the 1:50,000 BC Watershed Atlas and information such as known fish distributions, accepted fish species ranges and fish stocking locations. Information on salmon escapement has recently been added. Standard stream reports give you stream name, length, fish species present, obstructions to fish migration and tributary stream information.



Lake reports include lake size, depth, elevation, fish species present and stocking history. Lake depth maps, like the one shown above, can be downloaded and printed on your printer at home. Information is currently available on more than 30,000 streams and lakes in B.C. and more is added every day. Look for angling regulations to be available later this year. You get immediate access to our latest data with FishWizard.
