Many people will be listening and learning from your words and ideas over the next few days.

But most valuable of all, many people will undoubtedly be inspired by your trust in the innate potential of every man, woman, and child on the face of the planet. And that is the

greatest gift that any of us can share – inspiring others to unleash the power of their own imagination, compassion and humanity.

We live in a wonderful country and a great province. We are blessed with the strength of diversity and we are blessed with the strength of sharing by you coming together and joining us today.
