(1) Percolation tests are not performed on water. A percolation test is performed to determine the rate at which soil will absorb water. Results from this test are used to determine the type and size of the private sewage system.

The Saskatoon Health Region is responsible for administering the regulations that govern the installation of private sewage systems in the RM of Corman Park. The health region has advised that for the year 2005-06 their files include percolation test information on 3 private sewage system permit applications.

(2) Percolation test results and permits for private sewage systems in the RM of Corman Park are retained by the Saskatoon Health Region. However, the region has advised that the percolation test results for the three systems were: an average of 9 minutes per 2.5 centimetres; an average of 11 minutes per 2.5 centimetres; and an average of 18 minutes per 2.5 centimetres. A request for more detailed information should be directed to the health region and may be subject to *The Local Authority Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act*.
