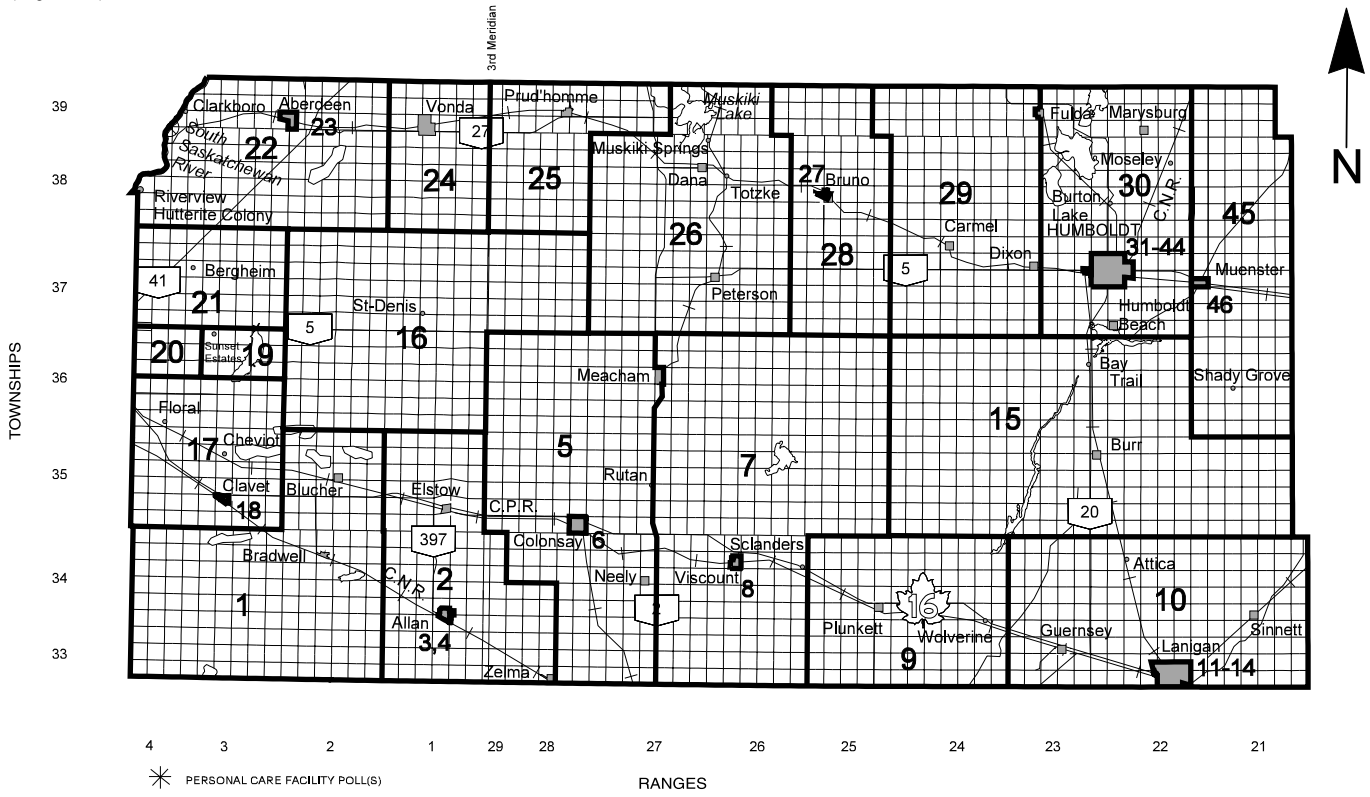

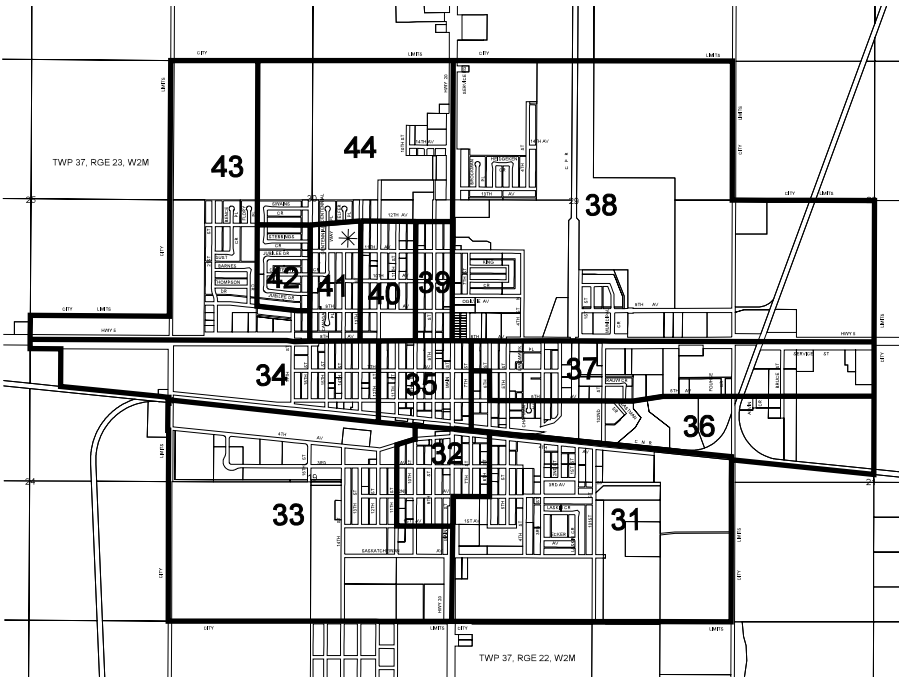




# Constituency of Humboldt
