DENTAL THERAPIST

What is a Dental Therapist?

Dental therapists are health care providers who conduct primary oral dental treatment and preventive dental services in a variety of settings. Dental therapists work with dentists to provide communitybased preventive health programs to meet identified community needs.

Job responsibilities include:

- Patient assessment;
- Oral diagnosis:
- Dental Radiology;
- Restorative Procedures;
- Local Anesthesia:

- Oral Surgery;
- Periodontal Techniques;
- Health Education; and
- Maintenance and Equipment Repairs.

A career as a Dental Therapist requires:

- A high degree of manual dexterity;
- Good vision:
- Attention to detail and precision work;

- Interpersonal communication skills;
- Basic analytical skills; and
- Commitment to life-long learning.

How do you become a Dental Therapist?

Employment as a dental therapist requires:

- Completion of a two year program in Dental Therapy
- Successful completion of the National Dental **Certification Board Examination**
- Registration and licensure with the Saskatchewan Dental Therapy Association (sdta@sasktel.net)

In Saskatchewan, Dental Therapists are regulated through The Dental Disciplines Act.

What do I Need to Get Into the FNUC Dental Therapy Program

- English B30 Minimum of 70%
- *Biology 30 Minimum of 70%
- An essay indicating why the application is interested in a career in dental therapy
- Documentation of immunization against Rubella, Tetanus, Polio and Hepatitis A & B

*If biology is not available, another science 30 is required.
