Keynote speaker:

Myra Zubot Mitchell is currently a Curriculum Development Specialist at the RCMP Training Academy in Regina. She worked for nine years as an Instructional Designer in Distributed Learning with the Center of Continuing Education, University of Regina. Myra also has several years experience as a Distance Education and Adult Education Consultant and has offered services as a Life Skills Instructor, Palliative and Pastoral Care Counsellor, and Crisis Counsellor at St. Paul's Hospital and the Saskatoon Crisis Intervention Center. She has a Masters of Continuing Education, a Bachelor of Social Work and a Diploma in Social Policy and Administration.

Myra has facilitated decision-making regarding appropriate methods and modes of delivery for both face-to-face and technology-mediated instruction. Her background in presenting, training and facilitating includes numerous workshops in how to use specific technologies and when best to use them.

Myra's presentation style demystifies the technology and replaces fear and apprehension with fun and involvement.

Diana Barr is currently a Consultant with the Saskatchewan Indian Institute of Technologies. She has served as a consultant to SIIT for the past 4 years on a diverse range of educational issues including a focus on distance and online learning initiatives. She has lectured and conducted professional training programs on both national and international levels on both criminal justice and community development issues and is the author of 9 educational publications on child abuse and victim/witness issues. Most recently she acted as a consultant to SIIT on the P.A.C.E. Crystal Meth program and has moderated E-learning programs for SIIT since 2004.
