English Readiness

The English Readiness program uses an interactive web site to help adult students improve their basic reading and writing skills in preparation for post-secondary education. A print package supplements the material available online.

A personal tutor works with an incoming student to design a suitable program, based upon a written diagnostic exercise. The instructor charts the student's progress by assigning and evaluating exercises and responding to the student's writing. The student develops writing skills by reading and analyzing poems, short stories, plays and articles. At least one-half of these are materials written by First Nations authors.

The student regularly meets online with the instructor and participates in bulletin board and chat room discussions with the instructor and other students.

English Readiness provides an individualized and interactive learning environment for adults, with Aboriginal cultural context. Students gain confidence in university-level English courses and improve their employment prospects by developing writing skills.
