# Common Platform: Computer-Mediated Communication and File Transfer

## **University of Saskatchewan**

This program is a cooperative effort between the two universities and SIAST to implement a common technical vehicle for courses using computer-mediated communication. The partnership provided access to the FirstClass server and client software and developed, pilot tested and evaluated instructional guides for instructors, students and technical support staff in using the software.

Learning how to use a new technology is a significant challenge for learners in technology-enhanced courses. The common platform helps the institutions to expand their online instruction capacity by ensuring system-wide compatibility.

FirstClass features group conferencing and private e-mail facilities. It supports interaction in issuesbased courses and easy distribution of documents.

A common platform also makes it easier for students taking online courses from either university or SIAST, in that they only have to adjust to one software package.
