# Training of Trainers: Supporting Learners Through FirstClass Software

# **University of Regina**

The Training of Trainers: FirstClass program integrates with the Common Platform: Computer-Mediated Communication and File Transfer program developed by the University of Saskatchewan. It is a workshop designed to train instructors and administrators to support students enrolled in courses using FirstClass computer conferencing software. The workshop provides an overview of computer-mediated communication, basic hardware and software troubleshooting tips, practice with FirstClass and techniques for supporting learners. A print package includes the FirstClass instructor and student manuals and client software provided by the University of Saskatchewan.

Participants become part of a province-wide pool of resource personnel to provide training for colleagues and student support through Regional College and SIAST campuses. The institutions provide basic technical support and arrange access to the hardware and software required.

A significant challenge for students in technology-enhanced courses is learning how to use new technology. This workshop trains resource people who provide easily accessible support to students using FirstClass computer conferencing software.
