### Yes, It's Big!

- Our \$2-billion food and beverage processing industry includes more than 250 processors and over 7,000 employees
- The industry produces about 20% of our total manufacturing and processing output
- Saskatchewan foods are set on dinner tables around the world:
  - Flour products and bakery mixes
  - Beef, pork and chicken products
  - o Jams, jellies and other preserves
- Food products with certified organic status
- Specialty foods, snack foods and confections

## And Getting Bigger

There will be a lot more crops grown for *non-food* uses in the 21st century

- With 44% Canada's cultivated farmland 50 million acres we can supply crops for:
  - o Ethanol grain based
- Strawboard from wheat straw
- o Paint and linoleum from linseed oil o Textiles from flax fibre or flax seed
- Paper from flax fibre
- o Bio-diesel from canola

- Meat processing and slaughtering
  - o Beef, pork and chicken processing
  - Specialty meat processing

  - Edible oils from canola
- Fruit products
  - o Wines, jams, pie fillings, syrups
- Specialty and gourmet foods
  - o Organic products from grains and livestock
  - Specialty livestock
- Nutraceuticals and functional foods
  - Herb or spice-based products
  - Dietary supplements and medicinal herbs
- Non-food and non-traditional food products
  - Dermaceuticals (oats)
  - o Detergents (canola)
  - o Biodegradable lubricants, bio-diesel fuel
- Hemp or flax fibre-based products
- Pharmaceuticals
