Background

Central to the legitimacy of representative government is the integrity of the electoral system. Public confidence in the institution of government rests directly on the capacity of the electoral system to perform efficiently, reliably, impartially and in a timely manner. Pursuant to these objectives, *The Election Act, 1996* (the "Act") contains financial reporting provisions to ensure registered political parties and candidates achieve the transparency goals inherent in the Act. Of particular emphasis was the objective of heightened financial disclosure to enhance public confidence and political stakeholder accountability.

Preliminary Remarks

The Report of the Chief Electoral Officer respecting Campaign Contributions and Expenditures (Volume II) complements the Statement of Votes (Volume I) of the Twenty-fifth Provincial General Election, which was tabled by the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly on July 29, 2004.

The Statement of Votes provides an overview of election administration and encapsulates the official voting results by polling division for the Province's fifty-eight (58) constituencies. This reporting of Campaign Contributions and Expenditures depicts election financial activities of registered political parties and of candidates. More specifically, Volume II sets out the amounts paid to chief official agents and business managers in respect of each registered political party and candidate, pursuant to sections 264 and 265 of the Act. Also included in this Volume is summary data for election administration related expenditures of Elections Saskatchewan.

Election Expense Limits

Election campaign activities of registered political parties and candidates are subject to certain expense limitations under the Act. In respect of spending, election expense limitations are imposed on the amounts that can lawfully be incurred by a party or candidate. A second limit regulates the reimbursement entitlement of a qualifying party or candidate (and reimbursement of auditor accounts).

Expense limits are based on factors specific to which the expenses pertain (i.e., general election or by-election), on whether an election is held in a northern or southern constituency ("southern constituency" includes all constituencies with the exception of Athabasca or Cumberland) and on an established formula, adjusted each calendar year. Expense limit information is available in *The Saskatchewan Gazette* or at Elections Saskatchewan upon request.

Registered Political Party and Candidate Financial Reporting

In accordance with section 251 of the Act, audited Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses, Form E-524, were required to be filed with the Chief Electoral Officer within six (6) months of polling day (June 5, 2003). Under section 261 of the Act, candidates were required to file an audited Candidate's Return of Election Expenses, Form E-412, with their constituency returning officer, for subsequent forwarding to the Chief

Electoral Officer, within three (3) months of the candidate returned being declared elected (February 17, 2004). Pursuant to the Act, within thirty (30) days of receipt, the Province's constituency returning officers publish, in prescribed form, a summary of all returns respecting candidate election expenses.

On December 18, 2003, the New Democratic Party, Sask. Section, pursuant to *The Controverted Elections Act*, filed a petition in the Saskatchewan Court of Queen's Bench seeking to set aside the electoral result for the constituency of Lloydminster (on August 13, 2004, the petition was withdrawn). This event did not affect the specified deadline under the Act for the filing of the Candidate's Returns of Election Expenses. Candidate returns were received within the specified filing deadline for all but one candidate. The business manager of the Saskatchewan Liberal Association candidate in the constituency of Rosthern-Shellbrook did not file the required Candidate's Returns of Election Expenses for his candidate. Election expenses returns for registered political parties were also filed in accordance with the specified deadline.

i) Registered Political Parties

The November 5, 2003, election acknowledged seven (7) political parties for purposes of fielding candidates. To maintain party registration, registered political parties must endorse at least ten (10) candidates in a general election pursuant to clause 227(1)(b) of the Act. Only six registered political parties fielded ten or more candidates for the Twenty-fifth General Election. On December 29, 2003, The Indigenous Party of Saskatchewan was deleted from the Register of Political Parties for its non-compliance with the provisions of clause 227(1)(b) of the Act. Appendix I of this Volume contains a listing of the names and abbreviations of the Province's political parties, their respective leaders and chief official agents, as recognized in the Register of Political Parties maintained pursuant to section 231 of the Act¹.

A registered political party that endorsed candidates who obtained in the aggregate not less than fifteen (15) per cent of the valid votes cast in the election and whose chief official agent filed a Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses, pursuant to section 264 of the Act, was entitled to receive a reimbursement of a portion of its election expenses from the Province's General Revenue Fund. Under section 243 of the Act, each registered political party was entitled to spend \$739,877.00 during the campaign. The amount reimbursed to a qualifying party was the lesser of either (a) \$221,964.00 or (b) one third of its election expenses.

The Act is specific in respect of payment of reimbursement of eligible election expenses to qualifying parties. As such, following receipt of an audited return, the Chief Electoral Officer conducts a preliminary review and thereafter forwards an interim payment of seventy-five (75) per cent of allowable election expenses claimed. Upon completion of a detailed compliance review, a final payment of twenty-five (25) percent of the total amount of eligible election expense is paid.

Appendix III sets out a summary of eligible expenses incurred by the six registered political parties and the amounts paid in respect of the parties who qualified for reimbursement. Contributions made to political parties are not listed in the Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses, but are set out in each Registered Political Party's Fiscal Period Return, Form E-521, filed in accordance with section 250 of the Act. Comparative summary data for election expenses incurred by registered political parties in 2003 and seven (7) preceding general elections is contained in Appendix VI.

ii) Candidates

There were 235 candidates nominated for the 2003 election; 58 Liberal, 58 New Democrat, 58 Saskatchewan Party, 27 New Green Alliance, 18 Western Independence Party, 11 Progressive Conservative and 5 Independent. The candidate endorsed by the Western Independence Party in the constituency of Humboldt withdrew after nomination but before the close of polls on polling day. Under section 236 of the Act, each candidate was required to appoint a business manager whose responsibility was to report the candidate's receipt of contributions and campaign expenses. Each candidate was also required to appoint an auditor, pursuant to section 238 of the Act. A list of the names, addresses and occupations of the candidates nominated, together with the names and addresses of their respective business managers can be found in Appendix II of this Volume.

Candidates were limited in respect of the amount of money that each could spend in their respective campaigns, pursuant to section 252 of the Act. A candidate in the 56 southern constituencies was entitled to spend (a) the sum of \$44,393.00 or (b) a sum obtained by multiplying the number of voters in the constituency by \$2.96, whichever sum was larger. The limit for each candidate who ran in either of the northern constituencies of Athabasca or Cumberland was (a) the sum of \$59,190.00 or (b) a sum obtained by multiplying the number of names on the voters' list in the constituency by \$5.91, whichever sum was larger.

A candidate who obtained not less than fifteen (15) per cent of the total number of valid votes cast in the constituency in which they were a candidate and whose business manager filed with the constituency returning officer a Candidate's Return of Election Expenses, pursuant to section 265 of the Act, was entitled to a reimbursement of a portion of their election expenses from the General Revenue Fund. The amount reimbursed to a qualifying candidate was an amount equal to one half of the candidate's election expenses to a maximum of \$22,196.50, or in the case of the two northern constituencies of Athabasca and Cumberland reimbursement of election expenses to a maximum of \$29,595.00.

For the November 5, 2003 election, there were 139 candidates who qualified for reimbursement receiving in the aggregate \$2,003,591.59. In accordance with section 265 of the Act, reimbursements were paid by installment: seventy-five (75) per cent being released following preliminary review by the Chief Electoral Officer with the remaining twenty-five (25) per cent forwarded following conduct of a detailed compliance review.

On September 17, 2004, the Office, pursuant to section 262 of the Act, published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette* (Vol. 100, No. 38) a summary of candidate contributions received and expenses incurred in the course of the general election, as well as the amounts paid in respect of each candidate who qualified for reimbursement. Such contributions, expenditures and reimbursements are reported in Appendix IV.

A summary of total contributions received, expenses incurred and reimbursements paid on behalf of independent candidates and of candidates of each of the registered political parties is set out in Appendix VII. For comparative purposes, the same data is provided for the 1999, 1995, 1991, 1986, 1982, 1978 and 1975 general elections.

Finally, Appendix VIII of this Volume contains a summary by political party of candidates nominated, numbers of candidates in respect of whom returns were filed and numbers of candidates reimbursed in the 2003 and seven (7) preceding general elections.

Auditors

The reporting requirements and the responsibility assumed through consenting to appointment as auditor of a registered political party² or candidate includes reporting in writing to the chief official agent or business manager on the respective election expenses return prepared on behalf of the party or individual candidate.

The auditor must employ generally accepted accounting principles and generally accepted auditing standards when conducting review of spending and financial records of a party or candidate. Auditors' duties extend to thorough examination of the accounting records of a party or of a candidate permitting him to reach an opinion as to whether the return examined presents fairly the transactions contained in the accounting records on which the return is based. It is compulsory that the party's chief official agent or candidate's business manager provide the information and explanations necessary to facilitate preparation of the auditor's report. In instances where the auditor has reason to believe or is suspicious that proper accounting records were not kept by the party or candidate the auditor must report same.

An auditor's account of a registered political party or candidate is reimbursable regardless of whether the party/candidate qualifies for reimbursement. Pursuant to subsections 267(6) and (3) of the Act, the maximum reimbursement for auditing services rendered in respect of preparation of a report pertaining to registered political party and candidate election expense returns was \$2,272.00 and \$737.00, respectively. See Appendix IX for aggregate amounts paid for auditor reimbursement – both in respect of registered political parties and candidates.

Orders and Authorizations of the Chief Electoral Officer

The Chief Electoral Officer may make exceptions to the Act's financial reporting provisions for election purposes for both registered political parties and candidates. In such instances, the Act under subsection 286(1), mandates that the Chief Electoral Officer report on the situation and events surrounding the order or authorization granted.

Pursuant to subsection 262(7) of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer granted ten authorizations for the correction of omissions to individual Candidate's Return of Election Expenses – Ava Bear [3], Joan Beatty [3], Harold (Buckley) Belanger [1], Joanne Crofford [1] and Peter Prebble [1], New Democratic Party, Sask. Section and D.F. (Yogi) Huyghebaert [1], The Saskatchewan Party. See Appendix V for the particulars regarding the aforementioned authorizations.

Elections Saskatchewan Expenditures

Elections Saskatchewan incurred election expenditures of \$6,969,298.19 inclusive of administrative and constituency account payments for the 2003 General Election. This expenditure figure represents a total cost per voter of \$11.55 or \$2.03 per voter for administration and \$9.52 per voter for constituency expenditure. In addition to the foregoing, Appendix IX establishes the Chief Electoral Office's election expenditures incurred for provision of central co-ordination and support to constituency returning officers and aggregate costs associated with the conduct

of the election in the Province's fifty-eight constituencies. Also summarized in Appendix IX are total election expenditures for each of the Province's individual constituencies. Should further individual constituency expenditure specifics be required, refer to the Detail of Expenditures *The Election Act, 1996 Provincial Constituencies Fiscal Year 2003-2004*, tabled by the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly on November 26, 2004.

Documentation

Candidates' Returns of Election Expenses and the related invoices and receipts may be viewed at the address of the respective constituency returning officer for a period of six (6) months after the return has been filed. Following the expiration of this period, pursuant to section 262 of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer holds the returns and the original financial documentation regarding individual candidate election expenses for a further eighteen (18) month period. The names and addresses of the constituency returning officers are set out in Appendix X of this Volume.

Also, pursuant to section 232 of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer is obliged to hold, in addition to the information contained in the Register of Political Parties, all original financial particulars concerning registered political parties' fiscal period and election expenses documentation for the purposes of public inspection. Such information is available to the public during regular office hours at Elections Saskatchewan.
