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### Call of By-Election

On February 19, 2001, after serving the constituents of Saskatoon Riversdale for over thirty years and the people of Saskatchewan for nine years, Mr. Roy Romanow, New Democratic Party, Sask. Section, vacated his seat, pursuant to section 36 of *The Legislative Assembly and Executive Council Act*. On February 19, 2001, pursuant to an Order of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, a Writ of Election was issued by the Chief Electoral Officer to Ms. Kay Burkhart, constituency returning officer. The Writ ordered that the by-election be held on Monday, March 19, 2001. An Election Calendar for the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election is included on the last page of the Official Report.

Prior to the March 19, 2001 by-election, standing in the Legislative Assembly included: 27 New Democrat, 26 Saskatchewan Party, 2 Liberal, 1 Independent and 2 vacant.

### Constituency Boundaries

The Saskatoon Riversdale constituency boundary was enacted in 1994 under *The Representation Act, 1994*, on the recommendation of the Constituency Boundaries Commission, 1993, as established under *The Constituency Boundaries Act, 1993*. Polling divisions for purposes of the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election included thirty-seven (37) regular polls. The Saskatoon Riversdale constituency polling subdivision map and Directory of Communities are set out in Appendices I and VI, respectively.

### Registered Political Party and Candidate Nomination

At the time of the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election, the Office recognized the existence of six (6) political parties in the Register of Political Parties, as maintained pursuant to section 231 of *The Election Act, 1996* (the "Act"). On March 3, 2001, nomination of candidates concluded. At close of nomination, only five (5) of the Province's registered political parties nominated candidates, as follows:

#### Enumeration

From the 19th of February through to the 28th of February, enumeration of eligible electors was conducted for the constituency's thirty-seven polling divisions. Pursuant to section 26 of the Act, constituency enumerators sat on March 15, 2001 to make necessary revisions to the voters' lists. As a result of these efforts, 8,302 Saskatoon Riversdale residents were declared eligible to vote, as established on the revised voters' list. In addition, pursuant to section 68 of the Act, eligible electors not included on the revised voters' list were entitled to vote by declaration.

### Polling

To facilitate the electorate's participation in the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election, an advance poll was conducted on the 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th of March. Regular polling stations were open from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. CST on March 19, 2001, enabling the constituency's 8,302 eligible voters the opportunity to exercise their democratic franchise. Eligible voters unable to attend either a regular or advance poll were entitled to vote by absentee ballot.

### **Electoral Results**

Unofficial electoral results were announced on the evening of March 19, 2001, resulting in Mr. Lorne Calvert, New Democrat, being declared member elect. Deposits were forfeited by the Liberal, New Green Alliance and First Nations Party candidates, pursuant to section 47 of the Act, for not obtaining at least one half of the total number of valid votes cast for the candidate elected.

On March 31, 2001, the constituency returning officer tabulated the results of votes cast by way of advance poll and absentee ballot. These figures were then reflected in the constituency results concluding the final count.

# SASKATCHEWAN Official Report (Continued)

Upon completion of the final count, on April 11, 2001, the constituency returning officer made a Return to the Writ of Election. On April 27, 2001, the Office published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette* (Vol. 97, No. 17) notice of receipt of the Return to the Writ and the name of the candidate elected.

Registered Political Party and Candidate Financial Reporting

Pursuant to section 251 of the Act, audited Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses, Form E-524, were required to be filed with the Chief Electoral Officer within six (6) months of polling day (September 20, 2001). Under section 261 of the Act, candidates were required to file an audited Candidate's Return of Election Expenses, Form E-412, with the constituency returning officer, for subsequent forwarding to the Chief Electoral Officer, within three (3) months of the candidate returned being declared elected (July 1, 2001). Pursuant to the Act, the constituency returning officer published, in prescribed form, a summary of Messrs. Calvert and Merrimans' returns respecting candidate election expenses prior to July 31, 2001.

### i) Registered Political Parties

As a southern constituency, the maximum amount of money that could be spent by a registered political party in the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election, as set out in section 243 of the Act, was, (a) the sum of \$34,900.00 or (b) the sum obtained by multiplying the number of voters in the constituency (8,302) by \$2.79, whichever sum was larger. A registered political party that endorsed a candidate who obtained fifteen (15) per cent or more of all valid votes cast in the by-election and whose chief official agent filed a Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses,<sup>2</sup> pursuant to section 264 of the Act, was entitled to receive a reimbursement of a portion of its election expenses from the Province's General Revenue Fund. The amount reimbursed to a qualifying political party was the lesser of either (a) \$11,633.33 or (b) one third of its election expenses.

All participating parties in the Saskatoon Riversdale by-election filed their duly audited Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses on or before September 20, 2001. Contributions made to political parties are not listed in the Registered Political Party's Return of Election Expenses but are set out in each party's fiscal period return, filed in accordance with section 250 of the Act. Appendix II sets out a summary of eligible expenses incurred by the registered political parties in Saskatoon Riversdale and the amounts paid in respect of each party who qualified for reimbursement.

### ii) Candidates

Candidates seeking election in Saskatoon Riversdale were limited in the amount of money that they could expend. Again, as a southern constituency, a candidate seeking election was entitled to spend, pursuant to section 252 of the Act, either (a) the sum of \$41,881.00 or (b) the sum obtained by multiplying the number of eligible voters in the constituency by \$2.79, whichever sum was larger. A candidate who obtained fifteen (15) per cent or more of all valid votes cast in Saskatoon Riversdale and whose business manager filed with the constituency returning officer a Candidate's Return of Election Expenses,<sup>3</sup> pursuant to section 265 of the Act, was entitled to reimbursement of

a portion of their eligible election expenses. The amount reimbursed to a qualifying candidate was an amount equal to one half of the candidate's election expenses to a maximum of \$20,940.50.

All candidates filed their returns respecting contributions received and election expenses incurred in the course of the by-election, duly audited, on or before August 24, 2001. On the 16th of November, 2001, the Office published in *The Saskatchewan Gazette* (Vol. 97, No. 46) a summary of candidate contributions received and expenditures incurred in Saskatoon Riversdale, as well as the amounts paid in respect of each candidate who qualified for reimbursement. Such contributions, expenditures and reimbursements are reported in Appendix III.

Orders and Authorizations of the Chief Electoral Officer

The Chief Electoral Officer may make exceptions to the Act's financial reporting provisions for election purposes for both registered political parties and candidates. In such instances, the Act under subsection 286(1), mandates that the Chief Electoral Officer report on the situation and events surrounding the order or authorization granted.

Pursuant to section 261 of the Act, the business managers for Mr. Dwayne Roth (Saskatchewan Liberal Association), Mr. Neil Sinclair (New Green Alliance) and Mr. John Melenchuk (The First Nations Party of Saskatchewan) failed to file their respective Candidate's Election Expenses Return (Form E-412) within the prescribed time period for the by-election held on March 19, 2001. On June 20, 2001 and July 3, 2001, Messrs. Roth, Sinclair and Melenchuks' business managers made formal applications under subsection 263(1) to extend the time period for filing their respective candidate's Form E-412. On June 20, 2001 and July 3, 2001, the Chief Electoral Officer, pursuant to subsection 263(3), granted the aforementioned applications and ordered the candidates' respective Form E-412s be filed with the Office by close of business on July 20, 2001 and August 2, 2001. The constituency returning officer published, in prescribed form, a summary of Messrs. Roth, Sinclair and Melenchuks' returns respecting candidate election expenses on July 12, 2001 and August 28, 2001. See Appendix IV for the particulars regarding the aforementioned orders.

### Elections Saskatchewan Expenditures

The total cost of conducting the March 19, 2001 by-election in Saskatoon Riversdale was \$118,585.07. This figure is inclusive of, and reported by, administrative and constituency expenditure. See Appendix V for an itemization of particular expenditures incurred in each of these two categories. Should further constituency expenditure specifics be required, refer to the Detail of Expenditures *The Election Act, 1996* Provincial Constituencies Fiscal Year 2000-2001, tabled in the Legislative Assembly on November 15, 2001.

### Documentation

Pursuant to section 232 of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer is obliged to hold, in addition to the information contained in the Register of Political Parties, all original financial particulars concerning registered political parties' fiscal period and election expenses documentation for the purposes of public inspection. Also held are the returns and the original financial documentation regarding individual candidate election expenses, pursuant to section 262 of the Act. Such information is available for public inspection during regular office hours at Elections Saskatchewan.







### Circumstances in which application was made:

Pursuant to section 261 of *The Election Act, 1996* (the "Act"), the business manager for the Dwayne Roth campaign failed to file the Candidate's Election Expenses Return (Form E-412) for the by-election held on March 19, 2001, in the constituency of Saskatoon Riversdale. Due to extraordinary circumstances surrounding the availability of the candidate the said business manager was unable to file the required Form on or before July 1, 2001. As a result, an extension for the filing deadline is required.

In my opinion, this circumstance makes the following authorization necessary:

### Application of order:

This order of the Chief Electoral Officer applies to the following:

Extension of time to prepare and file the required election expenses return (Form E-412) of Dwayne Roth, a candidate in the by-election held on March 19, 2001, in the constituency of Saskatoon Riversdale.

### Exception provided by order:

Pursuant to subsection 263(3) of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer grants the Dwayne Roth application filed June 20, 2001, pursuant to subsection 263(1) of the Act. Specifically, the aforementioned campaign has thirty (30) days from close of business on June 20, 2001, to rectify their deficiency and meet the formal requirements of section 261 of the Act.

### Circumstances in which application was made:

Pursuant to section 261 of *The Election Act, 1996* (the "Act"), the business manager for the John Melenchuk campaign failed to file the Candidate's Election Expenses Return (Form E-412) for the by-election held on March 19, 2001, in the constituency of Saskatoon Riversdale. Due to extraordinary circumstances surrounding the availability of the candidate the said business manager was unable to file the required Form on or before July 1, 2001. As a result, an extension for the filing deadline is required.

In my opinion, this circumstance makes the following authorization necessary:

### Application of order:

This order of the Chief Electoral Officer applies to the following:

Extension of time to prepare and file the required election expenses return (Form E-412) of John Melenchuk, a candidate in the by-election held on March 19, 2001, in the constituency of Saskatoon Riversdale.

### Exception provided by order:

Pursuant to subsection 263(3) of the Act, the Chief Electoral Officer grants the John Melenchuk application filed July 3, 2001, pursuant to subsection 263(1) of the Act.
