Please note that the following revisions were made to this document on April 14, 2005:

Executive Summary (page 1): The percentage of executive directors/agency heads indicating a personal history of alcohol or drug problems ranges from 28% to 35% in the Prairies, BC/NWT and Quebec. This percentage is lower in Ontario (17%) and lowest in the Atlantic region (5%).

Results (page 9): The majority of executive directors/agency heads cited "a lot of relevant experience" for their work and the percentage reporting a personal history of alcohol or drug problems ranged from 28% to 35% in the Prairies, BC/NWT and Quebec. This percentage is lower in Ontario (17%) and lowest in the Atlantic region (5%).

Appendix B (page 24): The last row of Table 4 ("Personal history of problems") should read 31% (BC & NWT), 28% (Prairie), 17% (Ontario), 35% (Quebec), and 5% (Atlantic).
