Definitions

The term ‘residential care facilities’ refers to facilities which have four beds or more and which are approved, funded or licensed by provincial/territorial departments of health and/or social services.

General Notes

Occurrences of less than three in a table are suppressed. Information about individual facilities is not released.

The response to the survey is about 80% of the facilities, containing 82% of the beds in the universe, [where ‘universe’ refers to all residential care facilities in Canada].
