INTRODUCTION

This finding aid is classified as a numerical list because it describes the fonds at the file level. Descriptive notes have also been prepared for the overall presentation of the fonds as well as for each series. The different levels of description thus enable researchers to locate the information by proceeding from the general to the specific.

The descriptive note for each file contains a file code, the title, the inclusive dates, the type of record (textual records, audio discs, photographs, etc.), the number or linear quantity of textual records and the number of photographic, iconographic or audio records, a description of the file's contents when it contains different types of records, and a section reserved for notes. This part is important because it contains information on the nature of the records (original and copies) and reference numbers for any sound recordings. In addition to the preceding elements, the introductions to the fonds and the series also include a biographical sketch (for the fonds only), and a section devoted to the scope of the records.

This finding aid does not contain any file marked "undated". Whenever undated records were encountered, a date was assigned using the following recording conventions: [1959?]: probable date; [ca. 1950]: approximate date; [197-]: decade certain; [197-?]: probable decade.

The file code, which enables files to be located quickly and accurately, is structured as follows:

The numerical list is also accompanied by an index of proper names and titles. The references in this index are to file codes, not to page numbers. For simplicity, the first two elements of the file codes have been omitted (for example, MUS 199/B3,2 becomes B3,2). In addition, an index of files has been established to match file codes with box numbers.

Lastly, this finding aid adheres to the standards prescribed in the *Rules for Archival Description*, prepared by the Bureau of Canadian Archivists.

MUS 199 OSCAR PETERSON FONDS. 1940–1998. – 2.42 m of textual records. – 598 photographs: b&w and col.; 57 x 48 cm or smaller. – 3 slides: col. – 8 graphic records; 65 x 88 cm or smaller – 8 audio tape cassettes (ca. 5 hrs).

Biographical Sketch

Pianist, singer and composer born in Montreal, Quebec, Oscar Peterson studied piano with his sister before pursuing his training with pianists Lou Hooper and Paul de Marky. In 1940, he won an amateur music contest and about this time began his radio program *Fifteen Minutes Piano Rambling*. In 1945, he was also a guest on the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation programs *Light Up and Listen* and *The Happy Gang*. From 1948 to 1949, he formed a trio with double bassist Austin "Ozzie" Roberts, drummer Clarence Jones and, for a time, guitarist Ben Johnson. The trio performed in the Alberta Lounge club and on radio station CFCF in Montreal. In 1951, under the management of American impresario Norman Granz, the artist formed a new trio (piano, guitar and double bass) in the United States. With his trio and as a soloist, Oscar Peterson gave many concerts in the United States, Canada and Europe.

An artist with an international reputation, he was among the highest-ranked pianists in a number of surveys by *Down Beat* magazine and other periodicals. In addition to the Montreal International Jazz Festival, Peterson has participated in numerous other festivals throughout the world, including the Montreux Jazz Festival, the Bergen International Festival, the Spoleto Festival, the Ravinia Festival, the Antibes-Juan-les-Pins International Jazz Festival, the North Sea Jazz Festival and the Molde International Jazz Festival. In 1960, he opened the Advanced School of Contemporary Music in Toronto with musicians Ray Brown, Ed Thigpen and Phil Nimmons. During the 1960s, he published his *Jazz Exercises and Pieces for the Young Jazz Pianists* and in 1985, became an Assistant professor at York University. On television during the 1970s, he hosted *Oscar Peterson Presents* (CTV) and *Piano Party* (BBC). In 1992, Elitha Peterson Productions Inc., with the support of the National Film Board of Canada and the CBC, produced the documentary *In the Key of Oscar* on Peterson's life and music.

Peterson's compositions include *Canadiana Suite*, *Hallelujah Time*, *Blues for Big Scotia*, *African Suite*, *Land of the Misty Giants*, *A Royal Wedding Suite*, *Easter Suite*, *Samba Sentive* and *Hymn to Freedom*. Winner of many Grammy Awards, he was also made an Officer of the Order of Canada (1972), Companion of the Order of Canada (1984), Officer of the Ordre des arts et des lettres in France (1989), Chancellor of York University (1991) and Chevalier of the Ordre national du Québec (1991).

Scope and Content

The fonds comprises records pertaining to the musical activities and popularity of Oscar Peterson. Among other items, the fonds contains biographical records, passports, correspondence, contracts, concert programs, promotional material, concert tickets,

itineraries, reports, posters, invitations, diplomas, musical works, texts of interviews, notebooks, periodicals, brochures, press releases, bulletins, calendars, press clippings, photographs mainly of Oscar Peterson and other artists, and sound recordings of other musicians.

The fonds comprises the following series: MUS 199/A Correspondence; MUS 199/B Concerts; MUS 199/C Awards, Honours and Tributes; MUS 199/D Printed Material Concerning Oscar Peterson; MUS 199/E Drawings, Serigraph and Reproductions; MUS 199/F Photographs; and MUS 199/G Miscellaneous.

Fonds acquired by donation from Oscar Peterson, in several accruals, between 1991 and 1997.
