











Investing in Canada's skilled tradespeople



In many skilled trades, apprenticeship training is key to becoming a certified tradesperson. The Government of Canada is working with its partners to increase apprenticeship opportunities and promote a highly skilled and mobile workforce in a growing economy.

WHAT IS THE APPRENTICESHIP INCENTIVE GRANT?

The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant (AIG) is a taxable cash grant of \$1,000 per year, up to \$2,000 per person. It is available to registered apprentices once they have successfully completed their first or second year/level (or equivalent) of an apprenticeship program in one of the Red Seal trades.

WHY APPLY FOR THE AIG?

The Apprenticeship Incentive Grant is meant to:

- 1. help cover some of your tuition, travel and tool costs.
- 2. encourage you to complete your apprenticeship program and get your Red Seal.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To be eligible for the AIG, you must be:

- a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or protected person
- out of high school
- a registered apprentice with an employer, training trust fund, union training centre, joint apprenticeship training committee, or apprenticeship authority
- ✓ in a Red Seal trade program that is designated as such in the province or territory where you are registered as an
- ✓ able to show progress within an eligible apprenticeship program by proving that you have successfully completed either the first or second year/level (or equivalent), through supporting documents

WHEN TO APPLY?

You can apply for the grant if you have completed your in-school technical and on-the-job training for the first or second year/level (or equivalent) of your apprenticeship program on or after January 1, 2007.

You will have until June 30 of the subsequent calendar year to submit your application. For example, if you complete year/level 1 (or equivalent) in February 2007, you will have until June 30, 2008 to apply. Detailed information is available at servicecanada.gc.ca.

HOW TO APPLY?

To apply for the AIG, follow these steps:

- 1. Fill out an AIG application form. Forms can be downloaded from servicecanada.gc.ca.
- 2. Provide supporting documentation that shows proof of registration.*
- 3. Provide supporting documentation that demonstrates completion of year/level one or equivalent or year/level two (or equivalent).*
- 4. Submit your application form and supporting documents to Service Canada. Service Canada will determine your eligibility.

*Proof of registration is defined by the province or territory in which you are registered as an apprentice. For more details on eligibility criteria and supporting documentation, visit servicecanada.gc.ca.

SUPPORT FOR SKILLED TRADES

The Government of Canada is taking action to build opportunities in the trades and encourage apprenticeship training in the workplace. In addition to the AIG, there are two tax measures implemented through the Canada Revenue Agency (cra.gc.ca) :

- Apprenticeship Job Creation Tax Credit a new tax credit for employers who hire apprentices
- · Tradesperson's Tools Deduction a new deduction of up to \$500 to tradespeople for the cost of tools used for work
