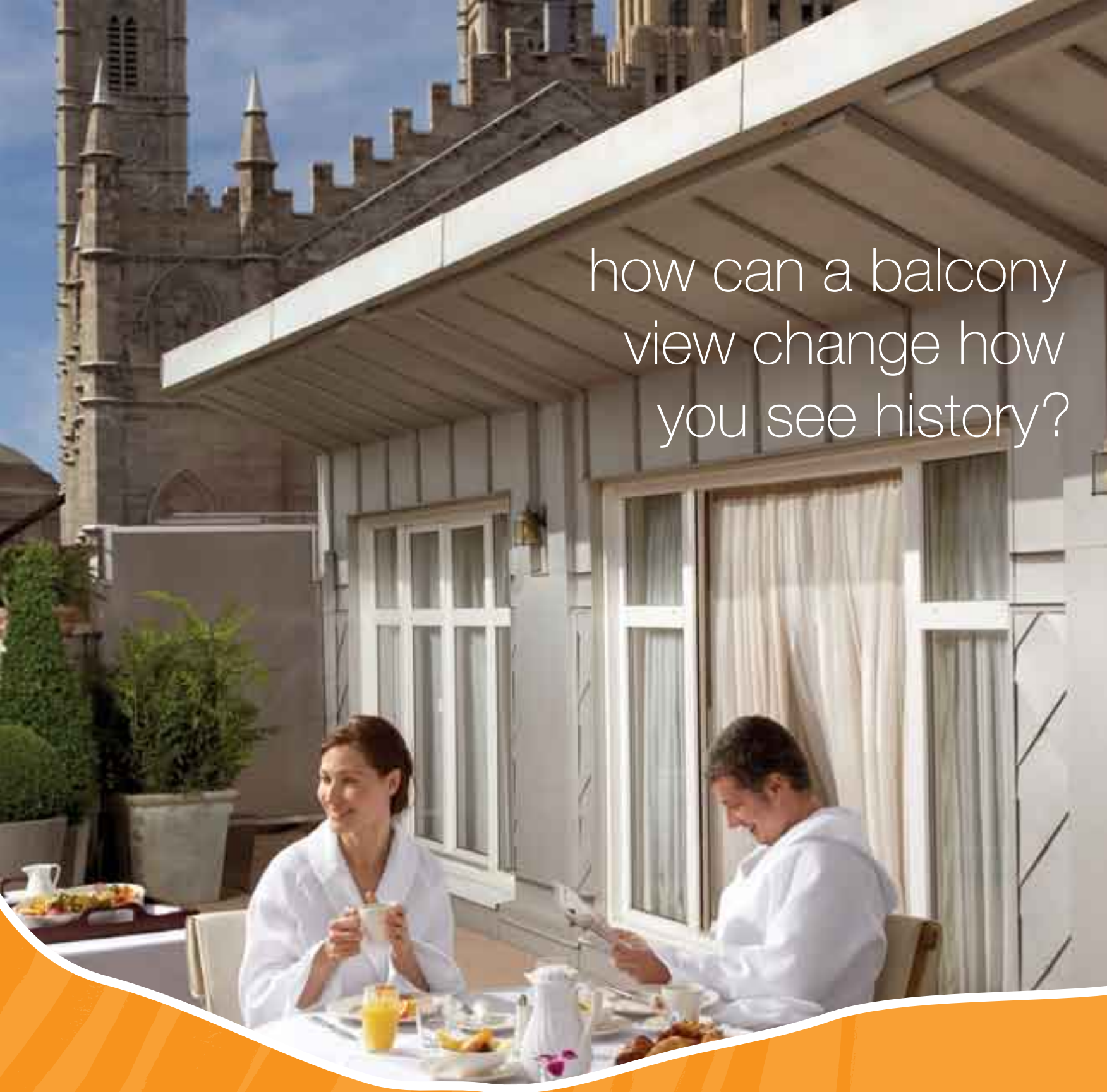

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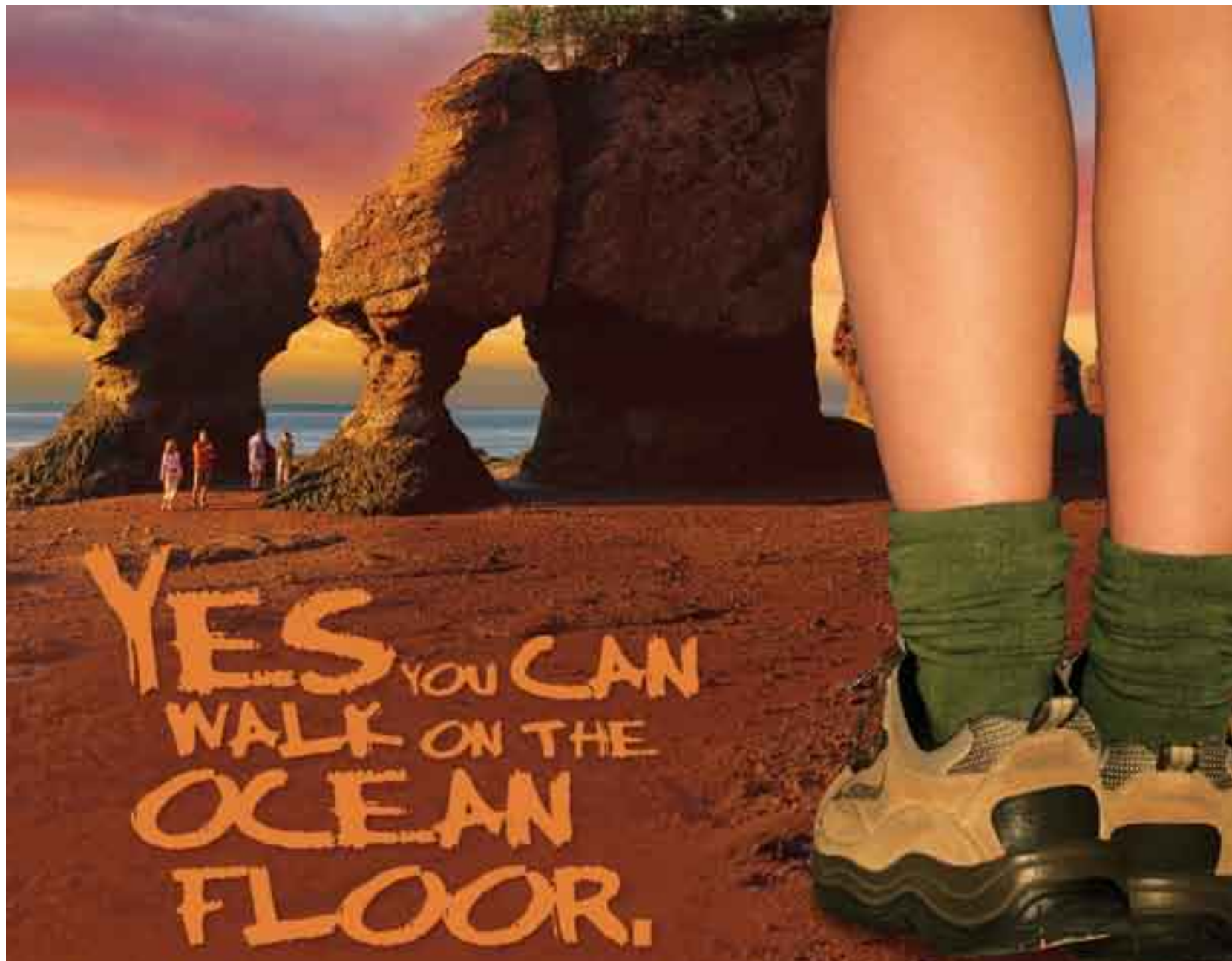

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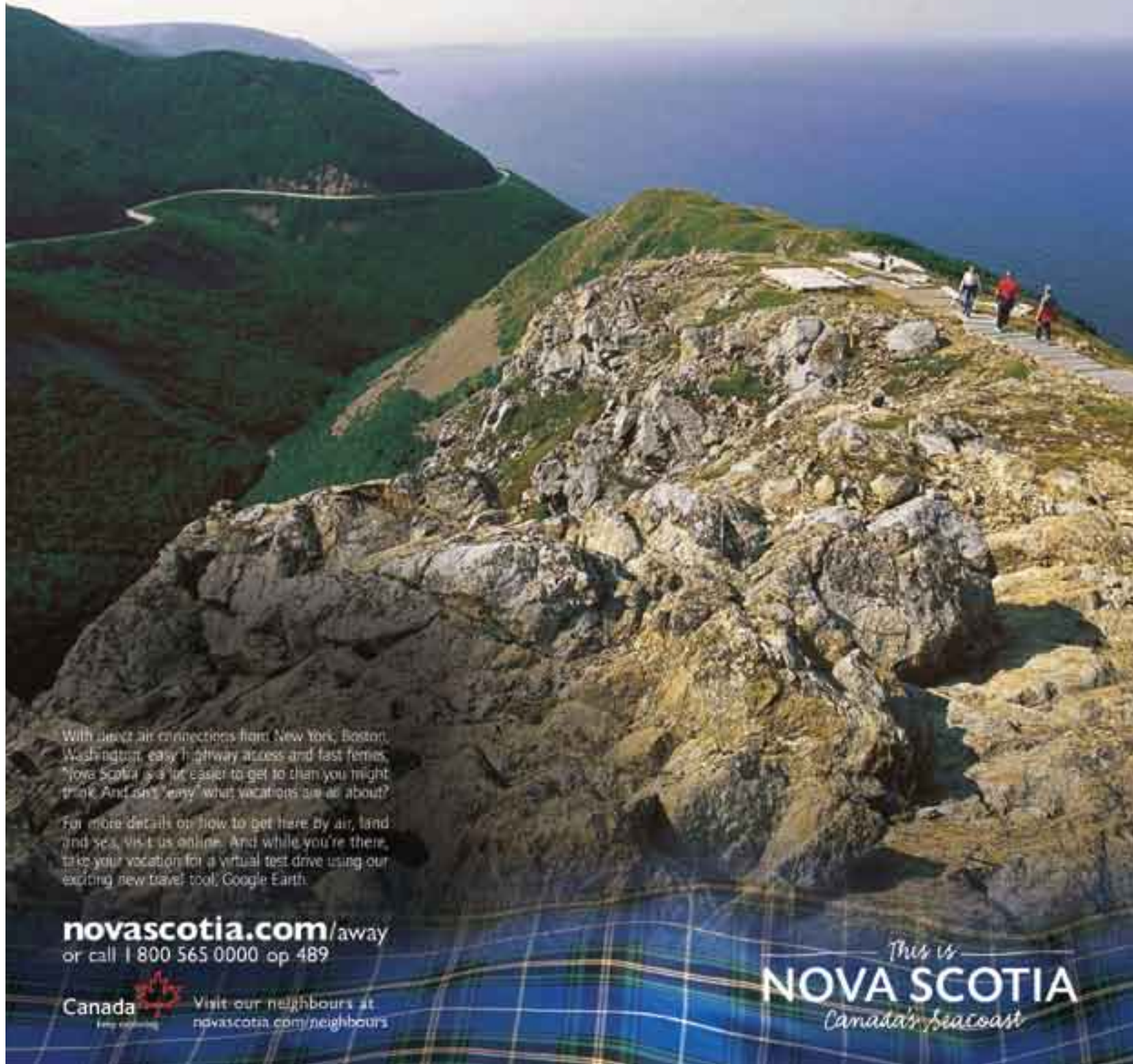


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New Brunswick Tourism and Parks

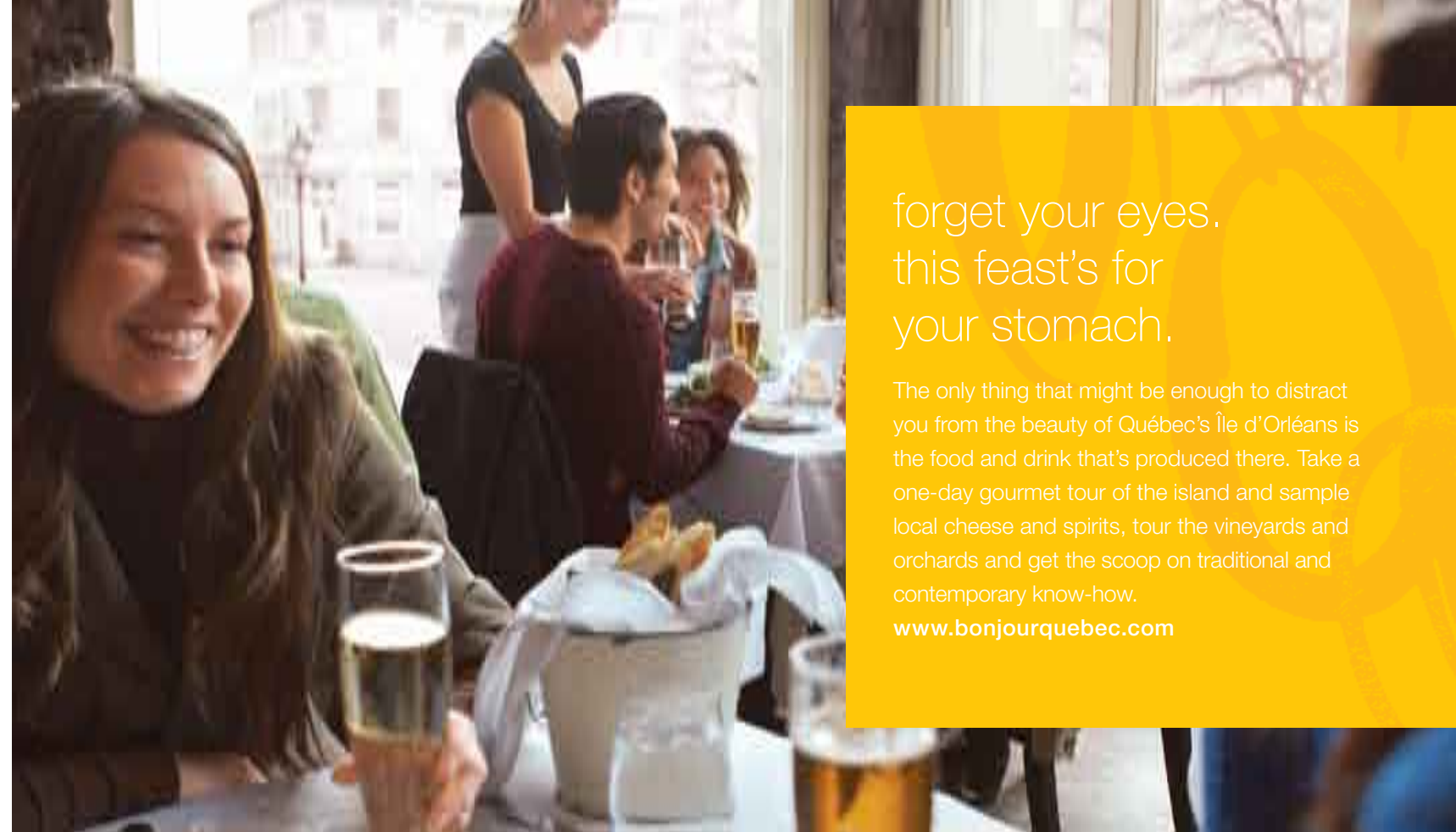
walk in Viking footsteps—




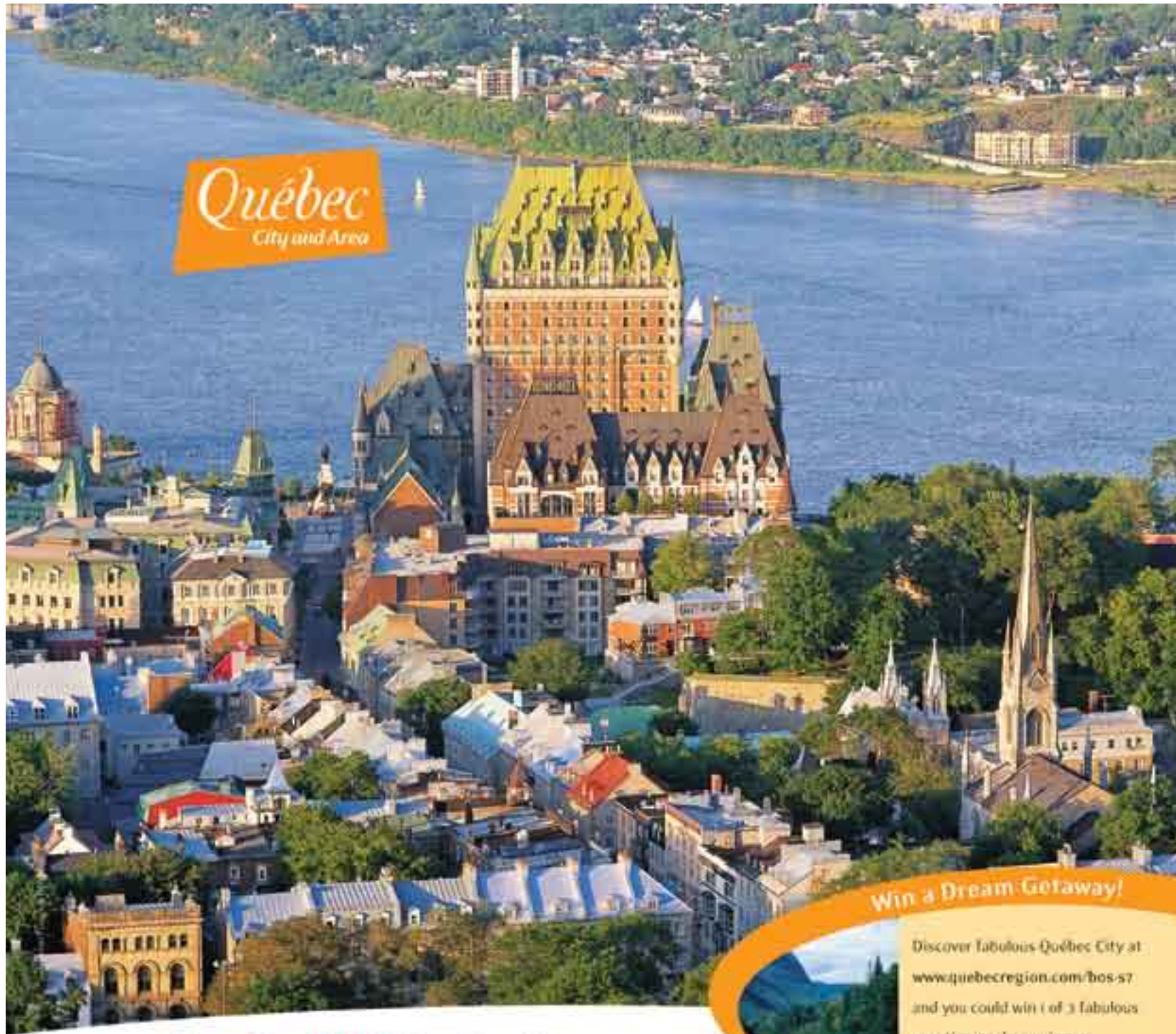

For 40 years now, this headline event has been a vast sounding board for musical trends from around the world, as well as an entertaining showcase for mimes, buskers and other street performers.



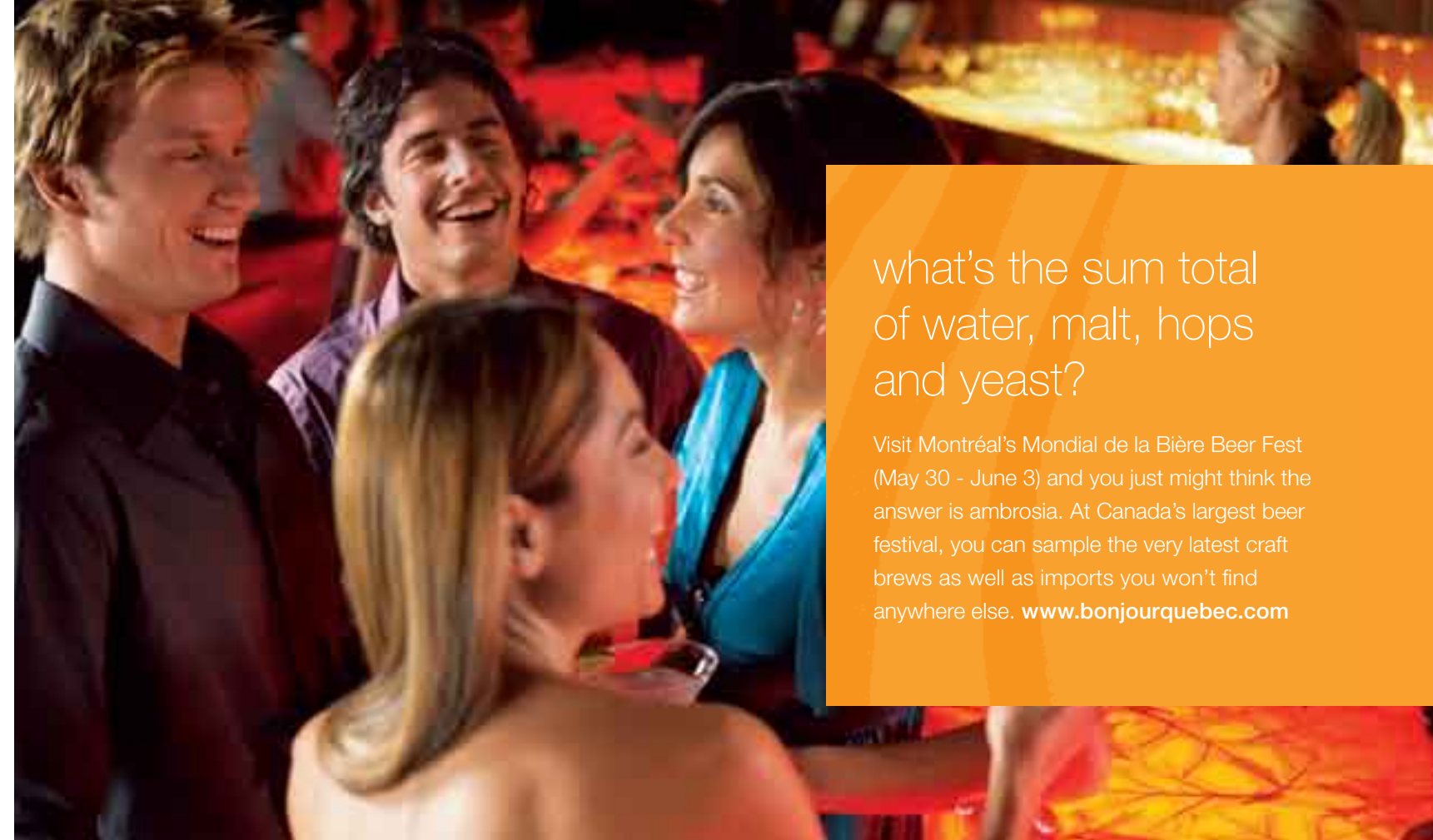

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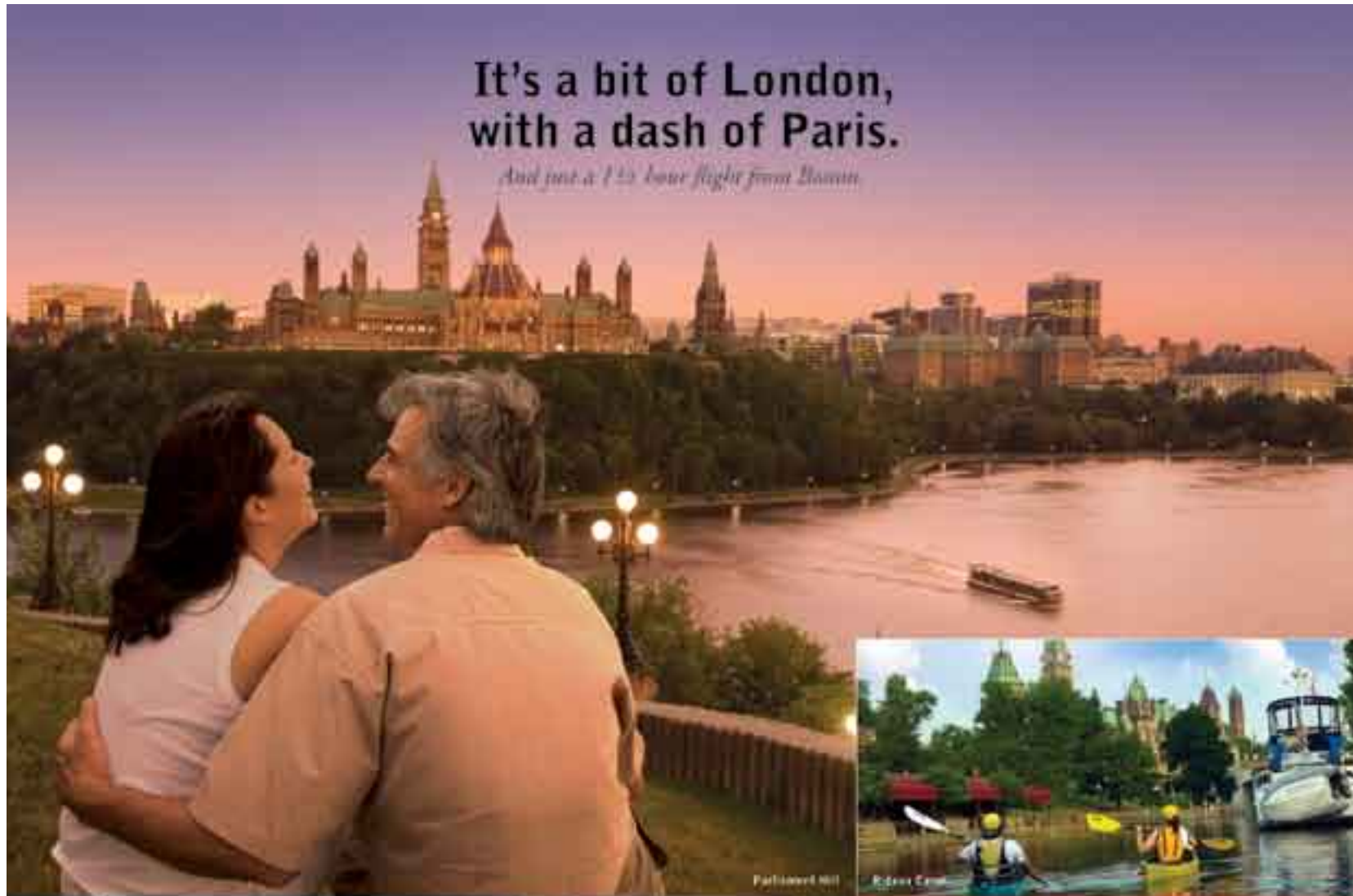

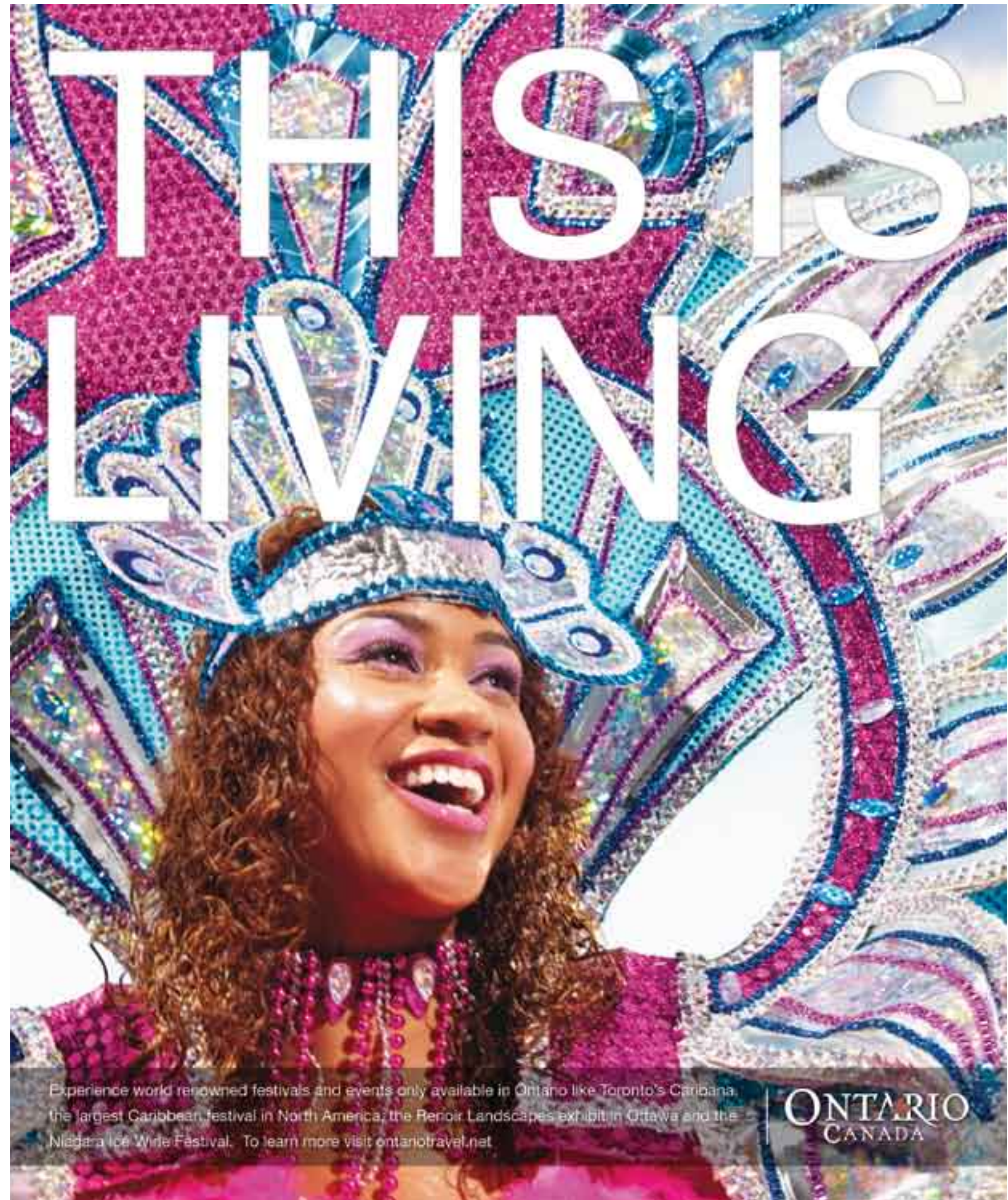
