Our lives and the world around us are full of patterns and rhythms. The National Arts Centre Orchestra's amazing percussion section will show you how music can make time speed up or slow down!






### **Ticket policy**

- How to make a fortune-teller
  - Cut the paper along the dotted line: you'll have a square piece of paper.
  - Put the paper coloured side down so that you're looking at the white side (the side with the folding instructions on it).
  - Fold the four corners of the paper towards the centre so they touch the middle of the black dot.
  - When all four corners are folded, flip the paper over. Again, fold the four corners towards the centre so they touch the middle of the red dot.
  - Fold the paper in half so the pictures are on the outside and the numbers are hidden inside.
  - Fold and unfold the paper a few times to soften it up a bit. Slide your thumbs and index fingers under the four flaps. You're ready to play!

### How to play

- Slide your thumbs and index fingers under the four flaps.
- Ask the other player to choose a number between 1 and 4.
- Open and close the fortune-teller that number of times.
- Next, ask the other player to choose another number. Spell out the number by opening and closing the fortune-teller one time for each letter.
- Ask the other player to select one of the four numbered flaps revealed when you stop. Lift up the flap and ask the question written underneath. (The answer is also given on the flap.)
- Play as many times as you like.
