

"Each course is well presented and always well received by our employees. The courses are customized to cover several guidelines specific to the pulp and paper industry including legislation, regulations and responsibilities."


Two-day intensive course

Courses are aligned with the best safety management standards.

Course modules give participants a thorough overview of safety principles and risk management, emergency preparedness and fire prevention, industrial hygiene, ergonomics, workplace inspection and accident inspection, and more.
