# Careers at Indian Oil and Gas Canada

## Accountant/Auditor

Planning, implementing and monitoring audit programs; reporting oil and gas prices, gas cost allowance, royalties and authorized deductions.

**EDUCATION:** Post secondary education with certification or eligibility for certification as a professional accountant (CAPP, CMA, CGA, CA).

## Administrative Support Positions

Provide administrative support services from the general clerical to the Executive level. e.g. Human Resources, Receptionist, Administrative Assistants.

**EDUCATION:** Ranges from high school diploma to post-secondary education with a diploma or degree in relevant programs.

## Contracts Analyst

Drafting oil and gas contracts and amendments; analyzing and interpreting existing land contracts.

**EDUCATION:** A Certificate in Land Administration or Land Management (or equivalent).

## Economist

Planning and conducting studies regarding crude oil, natural gas and gas products pricing developments and marketing trends.

**EDUCATION:** A degree in Commerce or Economics.



## Environment & Surface Analysts

Reviewing and approving environmental protection terms for surface agreements on First Nation lands as well as monitoring field operations for compliance with operating and reclamation requirements.

**EDUCATION:** A degree with specialization in environmental sciences, biological sciences, forestry, wildlife or agriculture.

## Land Administrator

Responsible for processing land transactions and monitoring all financial obligations.

**EDUCATION:** A certificate in Land Administration.

## Negotiations/Facilitator (Landman)

Facilitating negotiations of oil and gas contracts.

**EDUCATION:** Petroleum Land Management Certificate (or equivalent) or a degree in a related field.

## Petroleum Engineer

Oil and gas field operations, reservoir engineering and economic evaluation.

**EDUCATION:** A degree in Engineering and membership or eligibility for membership in APEGGA.

## Petroleum Geologist

Conducting evaluations for lease continuances; geological mapping; conducting detailed geological reservoir studies.

**EDUCATION:** A degree in Geology and membership or eligibility for membership in APEGGA.

## Petroleum Technologist

Providing technical support to engineering and liaising with provincial regulatory authorities; conducting field inspections.

**EDUCATION:** A Post-secondary diploma in Petroleum Technology.

## Royalty Analyst/Administrator

Reviewing and analyzing assessment reports of royalty entities to identify royalty payments due from producing wells located on First Nation lands.

**EDUCATION:** Post-secondary education in accounting, commerce or finance and a CAPP certificate is required.
