RE: United Nations Al-Qaida and Taliban Regulations (UNAQTR) – Amendments to Identifying Information

In a Press Release dated July 6, 2007 and published on its Web site on July 9, the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) announced that, on July 2, the Al-Qaida and Taliban Sanctions Committee approved amendments to the identifying information relating to sixteen individuals already listed. These amendments include the addition of approximately seventy aliases. Furthermore, on July 3, the UNSC approved amendments with respect to one individual; however, a press release has yet to be posted on the UNSC's Web site.

These changes will require significant updates to the tables posted on OSFI's Web site. We expect to post the revised tables by the middle of this week. In the interim, we are bringing these amendments to your attention.

OSFI will notify you as soon as the tables on the OSFI Web site have been updated to incorporate these amendments.

The UNAQTR require every Canadian financial institution and foreign branch operating in Canada to review its records on a continuing basis for the names of persons or organizations covered by the UNAQTR and report its findings on a monthly basis to the relevant regulator, which, in the case of federally regulated financial institutions, is the Office of the Superintendent of Financial Institutions (OSFI).

If institutions discover they are holding accounts for, or contracts with, persons or organizations covered by the UNSTR, they are required to report such information to both the RCMP and CSIS immediately. Information may be provided to these organizations as follows:

In addition, institutions reporting to the RCMP and CSIS that are also reporting entities under the *Proceeds of Crime (Money Laundering) and Terrorist Financing Act* are reminded that they are required to submit Terrorist Property Reports to the Financial Transactions and Reports Analysis Centre of Canada (FINTRAC).
