FAQ

Q: Will objects be appraised for their value?

A: No monetary value will be given to an object.

Q: How does the event work?

A: Visitors are invited to bring an object relating to transportation, communications, energy, domestic technology, physical sciences or space to display and to consult with the curatorial and conservation team.

Q: Can I bring several objects to display?

A: Each participant will be provided with 60 cm x 90 cm* space to display objects.

*Subject to availability: first-come-first served.

Q: What size item can I bring?

A: Objects must be able to fit through a standard door. Participants must be able to transport their objects. (If something is too large, feel free to bring a photograph instead.)

Q: May I drop off my object the day before the event or leave it unattended during the day?

A: No. Participants are responsible for their objects throughout the one-day event. Objects must not be left unattended.

Q: Can I bring an object to donate to the Museum?

A: We will be happy to provide consultation regarding items for donation; however donations will not be accepted on the day of the event.

Q: Can I sell my object on the day of the event?

A: No sales will be permitted during the event.

Q: What other kinds of objects can I bring?

A: Photographs, books, and trade literature relating to science and technology are also welcome.

Q: What else is happening during the event?

A: In addition to the display and consultation, the event includes: activities and stories for kids, a display of the Museum's books and trade literature, special presentations and more.
