Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to present the results of a survey of tobacco control by-laws in regions and municipalities across Canada that took place in the summer of 2001. Every region and municipality with a population over 5,000 was sent a survey. Where 60% of the total provincial or territorial population could not be reached by surveying areas with population of 5,000 or greater, regions and municipalities with populations less than 5,000 were surveyed. The total number of municipal and regional governments that were sent surveys was 965. Those municipalities and regions that sent in the survey but either indicated that they did not have a tobacco control by-law or did not send in a copy of their by-law were not included in the tables. A total of 251 municipalities and regions with smoking by-laws, who provided a copy of their by-law for analysis, form the basis of this report.

There is a clear trend that tobacco control and smoking restrictions are becoming more prevalent in Canada. Based upon the results of this survey, at the very least, 63% of Canada's population is governed by one or more forms of municipal, regional, or provincial tobacco control laws that restrict smoking. At least 30% of those municipal and regional governments with tobacco control by-laws have introduced them within the past five years and 31% of those with by-laws have amended them in one form or another during that same period of time. As well, there appears to be a trend of moving tobacco use restrictions up to higher tiers of government, from the municipal to regional level and also up to the provincial level.

Most of the by-laws analyzed in this report present a number of restrictions on tobacco use in public areas. While a large majority restrict smoking in municipally-owned buildings, offices, and facilities, more by-laws are starting to restrict the use of tobacco in other areas such as places of public assembly, hospitals, restaurants, licensed establishments, and on public transportation. Some by-laws may just restrict tobacco use to designated areas, others stipulate a total ban of smoking.

This report provides a summary and overview of municipal and regional by-laws in Canada. Since the time of data collection, in 2001, to the time of publication of this document, there have been additional amendments and many new tobacco control by-laws introduced. In conclusion, this report finds that steps are continuing to be taken to restrict and limit tobacco use and limit the exposure of non-smokers to second hand smoke in municipalities and regions across Canada.

Introduction

In 1995, Optima Consulting, under the direction of Health Canada, prepared a report entitled *Smoking By-laws in Canada 1995*. The report served as an update to one that was conducted in 1991 by the Tobacco Products Section of the Department of National Health and Welfare. This current report, *Tobacco Control By-laws in Canada 2001*, serves as an update to the previous reports and presents the findings of a survey of 965 municipal and regional governments from across Canada.

Although this report is an update of the previous reports, due to the restructuring of local governments and changes in the survey methodology, it does not serve as a direct comparison between past results. As in the 1995 report, this is not a comparative analysis of historical data, but a stand-alone document intended as a general reference guide to municipal and regional tobacco control by-laws in Canada as of October 2001. Since this report is designed as a guide, more specific details regarding by-laws should be obtained directly from the province, region, or municipality.

In this report, a by-law refers to a law passed by a municipal or regional government regulating local or internal affairs. This may also include policies and resolutions passed by these governments. In terms of tobacco control, while some local governments have no by-laws restricting tobacco use, others may restrict its usage in some areas while still others may ban usage completely. The areas covered by tobacco control by-laws are often defined using a broad range of definitions across Canada.

This report provides a comprehensive documentation of Canadian municipal and regional tobacco control by-laws as of 2001. In the course of the report, 15 areas of these smoking by-laws are analyzed from Tables 1-15. Table 1 provides a summary of smoking by-laws by province. Subsequent tables cover specific details for: municipal offices, buildings, and facilities; licensed establishments; elevators, escalators, and stairways; hospitals; places of public assembly; reception areas; restaurants; retail stores; service counters and service lines; public transportation; workplace; other restricted areas; by-law enforcement officers and fines; and signage. A brief overview is written for each table. Tables are organized with municipalities and regions for each province and territory (except Nunavut) on the left column and details of the smoking by-laws for that subject along the top.

Methodology

Information regarding tobacco control by-laws, policies, and resolutions of municipal and regional governments throughout Canada was collected using a mail-out method. A listing of the municipal and regional governments was acquired using the 2001 edition of the *Canadian Almanac and Directory*. This directory contains a listing of municipal and regional names, addresses, population sizes (based on 1996 census data), and contact names (usually chief administrative officers, clerks, or other administrators). Beyond a listing, the directory also contains information regarding the restructuring of municipalities and regions and provincial population figures (also based upon 1996 census data).

The following criteria were chosen in determining the municipalities to be included in the survey sample:

- ◆ All municipalities in Canada with populations of 5,000 or greater were to be sent a survey to complete. A minimum coverage of 60% of the total provincial or territorial population was sought among the municipalities.
- ◆ In instances where 60% of the provincial or territorial population was not reached by surveying municipalities of 5,000 or greater, municipalities with populations less than 5,000 were surveyed until the 60% lower limit had been passed.

Any region (with regions being defined as districts, counties, urban communities, rural municipalities, and regional municipalities) with a population of 5,000 or greater was included in the survey sample. There was no minimum coverage for the regions that were surveyed as it was assumed that in some cases not all of the provincial population lived under a regional government and in other cases no regional governments existed in the province or territory. Regional municipalities in Manitoba were not considered as "regions" but rather as "municipalities" because they did not have any lower-tier municipalities under their jurisdiction. Likewise, districts and

counties in Nova Scotia and municipal districts in British Columbia were considered as municipalities for the same reason. An overview of the population sizes of the municipalities and regions that completed the survey can be found in Table 1.

The mail-out kit consisted of an introductory letter, an English and French copy of the two-page survey, and a postage-paid envelope and was mailed in a large Health Canada envelope. The introductory letter advised the recipient of the purpose of the survey and asked that the survey be filled out and sent along with copies of any by-laws, policies, or resolutions (as well as amendments to these) that the municipal or regional government may have. Each introductory letter was addressed to the contact person listed in the *Canadian Almanac and Directory* (2001 Edition). In Quebec and selected municipalities in New Brunswick, the introductory letters were sent in French. Elsewhere, the introductory letters were sent in English.

The Municipal Tobacco Control By-Law survey consisted of two pages. The first page contained fields for information on the region or municipality and the second page contained the actual survey questions. If applicable, the seal of the municipal or regional government was to be affixed to the first page of the survey, otherwise the signature of the person completing the survey was to be applied so as to verify the authenticity of the data. A sample mail-out kit can be found near the end of this report.

There were three ways that a completed survey could be returned to Health Canada. These were:

- By mail in the postage-paid envelope, or a larger envelope if desired;
- ◆ By fax to a provided fax number; or,
- ◆ Electronically via email.

For the last option, the municipality or region could send an email to a specified email address with the subject line entitled, "Tobacco Survey." An email was then sent to them with accompanying attachments and instructions on completing the survey electronically. The attachments consisted of an html file for the English and French versions of the survey. These could be filled out using an ordinary web browser such as Netscape or Internet Explorer. When the survey was filled in, a button in the html file could be clicked that would automatically send the completed survey to a predetermined email address. The municipalities and regions that chose this option were contacted within three business days after the receipt of their completed electronic version to confirm receipt of their survey and to verify the authenticity of the sender. Municipalities or regions that elected to send in their tobacco control by-laws could do so using any of the three methods listed above, regardless of which method they chose to answer the survey questions.

The mail-out kits were mailed out on July 24, 2001. Three to six weeks later, phone calls were made to non-responding municipalities and regions in several provinces in order to increase the response rate. Information and by-laws for several non-responding municipalities in Ontario were obtained from a similar survey project being conducted concurrently on Ontario municipalities by the University of Waterloo. A listing of municipalities for which information was received from the University of Waterloo study can be found near the end of the report.

By-laws that were received from municipalities and regions were analyzed and presented in Tables 1 to 15. Those municipalities and regions that sent in the survey but either indicated that they did not have a tobacco control by-law or did not send in a copy of their by-law were not included in the tables.

Results

1. Summary of Smoking By-laws

Table 1 provides an overview of the areas that are covered under tobacco control by-laws in Canadian centres. This table also presents a summary of the survey results, displaying the year in which a given by-law was passed and any amendments that were accorded to it.

A total of 280 municipal governments and 32 regional governments indicated that they had a tobacco control by-law, policy, or resolution. Out of that amount, 229 municipalities and 22 regions provided a copy of their laws for analysis and form the basis of this report. A regional or municipal policy or resolution can essentially restrict the use of tobacco products in that region or municipality. Consequently, for the purposes of this report, policies and resolutions will also be considered by-laws. As well, in this report the terms *by-law* or *by-laws* will only refer to those laws that control the use of tobacco products.

In comparison to the 1995 report, there appear to be fewer municipalities with tobacco control by-laws (the 1995 report analysed 301 municipalities and estimated 367 with by-laws). However, several factors must be taken into consideration, namely that

- ◆ Since 1995 and particularly in Ontario, there have been several large mergers of municipalities and regional governments (i.e. Toronto, Hamilton, and Ottawa);
- ◆ There has been a shift in administration of tobacco control by-laws from the municipal level to the regional level; and
- ◆ More legislation has been implemented at the provincial level that has made some municipal by-laws redundant (i.e. the *Quebec Tobacco Control Act*).

Although the total amount of municipalities with tobacco control by-laws may have decreased, the percentage of the Canadian population affected by these by-laws may have increased. This is the case where several municipalities have merged together to form a new, larger municipality. If each of these municipalities were to have possessed a by-law, it would appear as though there was a decrease in the number of municipalities with a by-law, although the population covered by such a law would remain the same. If, before a merger, there existed municipalities without by-laws that now were covered by a new by-law, the population under this law would increase. The indication of this increase is that of the 229 municipal by-laws analyzed, 37% have been introduced since 1995 and 36% have had some type of amendment since that year. Similarly, of the 22 regional by-laws analyzed, 41% have been introduced since 1995 and 23% have been amended. In many cases, a regional by-law may cover many municipalities that do not possess a by-law of their own.

There are instances where there is a double or triple repetition in tobacco control laws, given the multi-tiered Canadian government system. However, each by-law may cover different aspects of tobacco control. This scenario occurs in Quebec where there exist provincial, regional, and municipal by-laws and in all other provinces where regional governments exist.

Since the introduction of the *Tobacco Control Act* in Quebec, there have been a significant number of municipalities that have rescinded or annulled their by-laws. While the 1995 report indicated that 66 Quebec municipalities possessed by-laws, only 37 indicated so in the 2001 survey. There appears to be a decrease in the number municipal and regional

by-laws since the provincial law was enacted in 1997. However, of the 37 municipal by-laws analyzed from Quebec, 41% introduced them after 1997 and 22% have been amended since that year. Likewise, of the seven regional by-laws from Quebec that were analyzed, five were introduced after 1997.

It may seem contradictory that some municipalities and regions in Quebec are introducing by-laws while others are rescinding them. However, it must be noted that the areas where a large majority of the introduced and amended by-laws cover are not covered by the provincial act. The primary area that is not covered by the provincial act, but is covered by the introduced or amended by-laws, is tobacco use in municipal offices, buildings, and facilities.

It is possible that municipalities in Quebec are in a period of flux between municipal, regional and provincial tobacco control laws that will eventually reach an equilibrium. A similarity to this is found in Newfoundland and Labrador, where a provincial tobacco control law was enacted previous to the 1995 report. Currently, only one municipality in Newfoundland and Labrador has indicated that it has a by-law, and as with the one introduced in Quebec after 1997, it only covers municipal offices, buildings, and facilities.

2. Municipal Offices, Buildings, and Facilities

Table 2 presents a summary of tobacco control in municipal offices, buildings, and facilities. Municipal offices, buildings, and facilities are usually defined as those owned by the municipality or region and may include community centres, arenas, libraries, and municipal vehicles (in this case, *municipally owned* also refers to regionally owned property).

A vast majority of the municipal and regional bylaws analyzed (72% and 96% respectively) prohibit smoking in some form in municipally owned buildings. Many municipalities enforce a total ban in all municipal buildings, while others prohibit smoking except in specified areas. Only a small number of municipalities or regions (16 and one, respectively) allow smoking when part of municipally owned facility is used for a private social function. Of those municipalities that possess a by-law prohibiting tobacco use in some form in municipally owned buildings, 69% require basic signage (further described in Table 10). For the regional governments, 29% of those by-laws require basic signage.

Although municipal offices, buildings, and facilities may have their own definition in by-laws, they may fall under other areas of a by-law such as those affecting places of public assembly, service lines or counters, or the workplace. Likewise, service lines or counters or the workplace may fall under areas governing municipally owned property.

3. Licensed Establishments

Table 3 specifies the areas of by-laws concerning smoking in licensed establishments. Such establishments are those that serve alcoholic beverages and include bars, night clubs, beverage rooms, taverns, or pubs. The definition may also include restaurants that serve alcohol.

Of the by-laws analyzed, 21% of municipal by-laws and 9% of regional by-laws control smoking in licensed establishments. Many by-laws give the proprietor the choice of establishing designated non-smoking areas while others require an area be assigned containing a certain percentage of the seating area. Ten of the municipal by-laws analyzed (none of the regional) call for a total ban of smoking in licensed establishments. In addition to requiring a designated smoking area, some by-laws may specify the boundaries of these areas and require specific ventilation levels.

It is worthwhile to note that none of the by-laws analyzed for Quebec contain areas regulating smoking in licensed establishment. The provincial act regulates this area.

A large majority of by-laws regulating smoking in licensed establishments in municipalities require the posting of basic signage when a non-smoking area is established (96%, 100% in regions). With respect to the proprietor's responsibility, only 16 of the municipal by-laws analyzed and one of the regional by-laws stipulate some form of responsibility. Most of those require the proprietor to make a reasonable effort to enforce a by-law and familiarize their staff with the by-law. To a much lesser extent, some by-laws require that the proprietor arrange a smoke-free area and only one municipal by-law required the proprietor to determine a patron's smoking or non-smoking preference in advance of seating.

4. Elevators, Escalators, and Stairways

Table 4 reviews by-laws that regulate tobacco use in elevators, on escalators, and in stairways. The number of analyzed by-laws that cover this area has decreased since the 1995 report to 31% (18% in regions). Most of these by-laws cover elevators, escalators, and stairways, while a small number omit one of the three.

Basic signage is required in 70 out of the 75 analyzed by-laws that prohibit smoking in elevators, escalators, and stairways. Five of the municipal by-laws stipulated that signs be posted specifically on the interior wall facing the door.

In terms of the responsibility of the proprietor, 14 municipalities and two regions require the proprietor to make a reasonable effort to enforce the by-laws while 12 municipalities and two regions also require the proprietor to familiarize staff with the by-laws.

5. Hospitals

Table 5 summarizes the by-laws that regulate smoking in hospitals. In addition to hospitals, some by-laws have expanded their definition of hospitals to include health and patient care facilities (as described in Table 13).

Of the by-laws analyzed, 24% of municipal by-laws and 14% of the regional by-laws had some form of restriction on smoking in a hospital. Only 18% of the municipal by-laws (none of the regional by-laws) with hospital smoking restrictions restricted smoking *in all areas* of a hospital. Another 16% (0% of regional) permitted smoking in designated areas with either written (seven municipalities) or oral consent (two municipalities) of the administration.

Most of those by-laws that permitted smoking in designated areas restricted smoking in *patient* care areas. Generally, 50% of the designated area (usually mentioned as a cafeteria) was reserved for non-smokers.

Most municipalities (87%) and all of the regions with the above restrictions required basic signage. In addition, a small number required additional signage for *smoking permitted* areas.

6. Places of Public Assembly

Table 6 deals with by-laws governing tobacco use in places of public assembly. Almost half of the municipal by-laws analyzed (45%) and 27% of the regional by-laws restricted smoking in some form in places of public assembly. Such a place was generally defined as an enclosed structure or building with access to the public and included, but was not limited to, recreational, entertainment, and educational facilities. The by-laws typically omitted places where private functions were being held and private homes from the definition. Nearly all of the by-laws for places of public assembly required basic signage be posted.

A third of municipal (33%) and four (80%) regional by-laws with these restrictions required the proprietor to either make a reasonable effort to enforce the by-law or familiarize staff. A much fewer number required the proprietor to provide ashtrays or arrange a smoke-free area.

7. Reception Areas

Table 7 reviews by-laws dealing with smoking in reception areas. Roughly a quarter of municipal (26%) and 14% of regional by-laws analyzed dealt with reception areas.

Of those by-laws dealing with reception areas, 32 of the municipal (53%) and one of the regional (33%) ordered a total ban of smoking. Another 20% of the municipal by-laws and 33% of the regional stated that the proprietor may designate a non-smoking area.

Most of the by-laws restricting smoking in reception areas required basic signage. Around 30% of municipal by-laws and all of the regions either required the proprietor to make a reasonable effort to enforce the by-law or familiarize the staff with the by-law.

8. Restaurants

Table 8 provides a summary of by-laws governing smoking in restaurants. A total of 39% of the municipal by-laws and 18% of the regional by-laws analyzed restrict tobacco use in restaurants.

Of those by-laws restricting smoking, 15% of the municipal and 25% of the regional provide for a total ban of smoking in restaurants. Others stipulate that an area ranging from 25% to 90% of the total seating area be reserved for non-smoking. A smaller number state that the proprietor may designate a non-smoking area.

A large majority (97% of municipal and 100% of regional) of these by-laws require basic signage be posted. Much fewer require additional signage for smoking sections (i.e. "Smoking permitted in this section only."). More than one third (38%) of municipal and three quarters of the regional by-laws with restaurant smoking restrictions require the proprietor to make an effort to reasonably enforce the by-law or to familiarize staff with the law. A much smaller number require that a smoke-free area be arranged or that seating preference be determined in advance.

9. Retail Stores

Table 9 provides an overview of by-laws governing smoking in retail stores. In certain by-laws, a retail store may fall under the definition of "place of business" or a "commercial area." In some instances, a retail store may be covered by regulations governing "places of public assembly."

Roughly 28% of municipal by-laws analyzed and 14% of the analyzed regional by-laws restrict smoking in retails stores. Of these by-laws, 41% of municipal and 33% of regional order a total ban on smoking in retail stores.

Many municipal and regional by-laws allow smoking in designated areas. These exempted areas tend to be staff lounges and other areas with no access to the public. For all but a few by-laws, basic signage is required.

Around 44% of municipal and 100% of regional by-laws with smoking regulations require proprietors to make a reasonable effort to enforce the by-law or familiarize staff with the law.

10. Service Counters and Service Lines

Table 10 covers by-laws regulating smoking in and around service counters and service lines. Of the by-laws analyzed, 31% municipal by-laws and 14% of the regional by-laws regulated smoking around service counters and lines.

Many of those with by-laws regulating service counters and service lines prohibited smoking in any service line (85% of municipalities, 33% of regions). Most municipalities and regions require basic signage be posted.

Around 30% of the municipalities and regions with service line and counter regulations prohibited smoking at any service counter of any facility, while others specified certain institutions where smoking was prohibited. Many municipalities also required the proprietor to make a reasonable effort to enforce the by-law or to familiarize staff with the law.

11. Public Transportation

Table 11 summarizes by-laws that cover the area of tobacco control in transportation. This table covers school buses, public transit vehicles (buses, subways, light rail systems), bus shelters, and taxis. While these areas may be covered by other municipal, regional, or provincial legislation, this table will only examine restrictions found in a regional or municipality's tobacco control by-law.

Of the 229 municipal and 22 regional by-laws that were analyzed, 30% and 23% respectively cover the area of transportation. Most of the by-laws prohibit smoking in school buses and public transportation and also require that signs be posted in both. Only a few prohibit smoking in bus shelters, also this area may be covered under other areas of a by-law, such as places of public assembly.

Most municipalities and regions will only allow smoking in a taxi cab upon consent of both the driver and the passenger. Usually, signage will be required to inform the passenger that consent is required. Where smoking is prohibited in all taxi cabs, basic signage is required.

12. Workplace

Table 12 deals with by-laws governing smoking in the workplace. The workplace is also defined in certain by-laws as "a place of employment" or an "office," and usually requires a business with two or more employees. The by-laws may exclude a workplace that is in a private home. Provincial legislation may also restrict smoking in the workplace.

Almost one quarter (23%) of the municipal by-laws and 36% of the analyzed regional by-laws restricted smoking in the workplace in some form. Of those by-laws that restrict smoking in the workplace, 87% of municipal by-laws and 83% of regional by-laws prohibit smoking except in designated areas.

Most of the by-laws require the posting of basic signage where smoking is prohibited in the workplace. Around one quarter (25%) of municipal by-laws and 33% of the regional by-laws with workplace regulations require that the employer give prior or immediate notification of the by-laws to the employees. Forty-three percent of municipalities and regions with workplace smoking by-laws require the employer to ensure compliance, arrange a smoke free area, or ban smoking if a mutually agreed upon solution is not reached.

13. Other Restricted Areas

Table 13 provides a summary of other restricted areas that may be covered by a tobacco control by-law. Such areas may include childcare, healthcare, personal healthcare, or long-term facilities, laundromats, libraries, recreational facilities, public restrooms, shopping malls and schools. Definitions of these facilities are sometimes extended in the by-laws to encompass a broader range of facilities. Recreational facilities tend to include bingo and pool halls, arcades, and bowling alleys while personal healthcare facilities tend to include spas, saunas, fitness centres and massage parlors. Furthermore, healthcare facilities tend to include doctors' offices and clinics and long-term care tends to refer to nursing and convalescent homes.

Around 31% of municipal and 23% of regional by-laws analyzed contained particular mention of other restricted areas. Restrictions on shopping malls, long-term care facilities and healthcare facilities tend to be the most prevalent.

Childcare, laundromats and personal health facilities tend to be the least covered in other restricted areas. However, these may still be covered by other areas of by-laws.

14. Enforcement Officers and Penalties

Table 14 provides an overview of by-law areas covering enforcement officers and penalties. Almost three quarters of municipal (70%) and 32% of regional by-laws analyzed discussed either enforcement of a by-law, a penalty of violating a by-law, or both.

A majority of analyzed by-laws assigned the task of enforcement to by-law enforcement officers, followed by persons authorized by the municipal or regional government, the police, then building inspectors. Only a small number of by-laws assigned enforcement to public health, fire prevention officials or building, planning or licence inspectors. Full-time equivalent of enforcement positions can be found in Table 1.

Fines for violating a by-law range from \$25.00 up to \$10,000.00, with several by-laws increasing the fine value for each additional infraction. Some municipalities and regions will also fine for failure of a proprietor to adequately enforce a by-law.

15. Signage

Table 15 summarizes tobacco control by-laws regulating non-smoking signage. Over 60% of municipal by-laws analyzed and 41% of the regional by-laws analyzed cover the use of non-smoking signs. Signage for all by-laws tends to be made up of or include a universal no-smoking symbol consisting of a smoking cigarette in a circle with either a bar or an "x" over it. Definitions that describe the symbol will usually include a facsimile in the appendix of the by-law and indicate that despite the symbol illustrating a lit cigarette, the by-law also includes other smoke-emitting tobacco products.

Most of the analyzed by-laws stipulate that a sign must have a visible and conspicuous placement. Some by-laws may continue to describe the placement of the signs in detail (giving measurements).

Further requirements for signs may include colouration of the sign and additional text that must be added at the bottom or top of the no-smoking symbol. Several by-laws gave the option of using either the symbol or wording on a no-smoking sign. Only a small number of analyzed by-laws indicated that additional signage must be placed as tent signs on tables, in entranceways, in buildings designated non-smoking, or in areas designated for smoking.

Conclusion

This report has provided a summary and overview of municipal and regional by-laws across Canada as of 2001. Since the time of data collection, in 2001, to the time of publication of this document, there have been additional amendments and many new tobacco control by-laws introduced. In conclusion, this report finds that steps are continuing to be taken to restrict and limit tobacco use and limit the exposure of non-smokers to second hand smoke in municipalities and regions across Canada.
