COMBAT CAMERA PHOTOGRAPHER REQUIREMENTS



OUR MISSION:

Combat Camera is the Electronic News Gathering (ENG) arm of the ADM (PA). Its primary role is to capture high quality imagery (still and video) of Canadian Forces members and equipment while deploying or deployed on operations.

These are some of the necessary skills and training Combat Camera Photographers require to perform their duties to fulfill our mission. They have been broken down into Basic and Advanced categories, as well as a section on Personal Professional Development.

BASIC:

- Qualified QL5 Photo (preferably MCpl) with experience at the Base Photo/Sect level using film and/or digital cameras shooting a variety of jobs, with an emphasis on photojournalism. Preferably have taken the AGAK Imagery Public Relations course or similar civilian experience.
- Be physically fit IAW <u>CFAO 50-1</u> (<u>http://www.admfincs.forces.gc.ca/admfincs/subjects/cfao/050-01_e.asp</u>) for missions.
- Familiarity with Nikon (nikon.ca/digital/) digital cameras
- Computer fundamentals: Basic knowledge of Windows Operating System and Macintosh Operating System. Some basic knowledge and use of <u>Internet search engines</u> (google.ca) for finding photo and other mission-related information.
- Basic knowledge of <u>Adobe PhotoShop CS2</u> (<u>adobe.com/products/photoshop/main.html</u>) and latest <u>Nikon Capture</u> software (found at <u>nikon.ca</u> under Imaging support center) for both PC and Mac Operating systems.

ADVANCED:

- Train skill-sets on missions and exercises which fall within the primary Combat Camera mission mandate to prepare for future deployments.
- Be issued CADPAT and complete summer and winter field kit IAW <u>Infantry School CTC</u> <u>Gagetown kit list</u> QL6B in support of CF operational deployments and IAW Combat Camera mission mandate. (Link can only be accessed through DND Intranet <u>http://ctc.gagetown.mil.ca/infantry/school/courses/document/3anxa_e.pdf</u>).
- Completed Deployment Readiness Screening IAW <u>CFAO-20-50</u> (http://www.admfincs.forces.gc.ca/admfincs/subjects/cfao/020-50_e.asp) and latest CANFORGEN <u>118/05 ADM(HR-MIL) 052 042110Z JUL 05</u> (vcds.dwan.dnd.ca/vcdsexec/pubs/canforgen/2005/118-05_e.asp)

- Knowledge of colour printing, calibration, and knowledge of colour profiles
- Other professional development i.e. attending seminars and trade shows such as <u>PhotoPlusExpo</u>, (<u>photoplusexpo.com</u>) Jacob Javits Convention Center, New York City.
- Completed <u>Defence Public Affairs Course</u> (DPAC) (http://dgpadgap.mil.ca/dailysummaries/Public%20Affairs%20Course.htm) course.



CAPTION BOX (DESCRIPTION)

In the CAPTION box, the first line should show the IMAGE DESIGNATED #. I.e.: IS2001-0024<u>a</u> (a=acquire Tif and Jpeg, c=conventional, v=video, m=montage and e=edit)

The 2^{nd} line should show the **DATE** the image was taken. The 3^{rd} line should show the **LOCATION** the image was taken.

The main paragraph that follows will include the **5** W's: WHO, WHAT, WHERE, WHEN, WHY AND HOW.

The last line of the **CAPTION BOX** will state **who captured the image**. **To keep the formatting of the text on the web site use the HTML code as shown on CAPTION BOX EXAMPLE ON THE NEXT PAGE**


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

With the use of file information within Nikon or Photoshop templates can be created and saved to save time when annotating images.

<u>BE AWARE</u> that when a template is created and used, certain fields should be amended to reflect the change in imagery. Examples would be the Caption, Keywords, Origin, Date Created, and Transmission Reference.

In order to release imagery, photos <u>must</u> have the basic File Information completed.
