FOREWORD

The annual graduate follow-up survey collects information from graduates of regular and non-regular training programs approximately one year following graduation. The information gathered provides valuable feedback on the success of graduates in the labour market and is an important tool for decision-makers. This tool, along with other sources, is incorporated into the Department's planning process.

This report presents the findings of the Survey of 2004 New Brunswick Community College Graduates. The survey was conducted with 1,794 graduates over a seven-week period starting July 18th, 2005. This represents a response rate of 75%.

The reference week for the survey was June 5 – June 11, 2005. Survey results indicate that graduates of the Class of 2004 were again very successful in locating employment, with an employment rate of 87%.

The Department would like to thank the New Brunswick Community College graduates who participated in this survey; their input has been invaluable.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The follow-up survey with the Class of 2004 from the New Brunswick Community College generated information from 1,794 graduates, representing 75% of the 2,385 graduates to be contacted for this survey.

The points that follow present key information obtained through the 2005 survey.

- The employment rate for graduates one year following their graduation was 87%, the same percentage that was reported in 2004.
- The employment rate for female graduates was 89%, one-percentage point lower than that reported in 2004.
- The employment rate for male graduates was 86%, an increase of one percentage point from the 85% reported in 2004.
- The unemployment rate for graduates was 12.6% in 2005, 0.3 of a percentage point lower than last year.
- Overall, the percentage of related employment since graduation as a percentage of total employment increased from 75% in 2004 to 89% in 2005.
- The level of related employment *in the 2005 reference week* increased by two percentage points to 80% over that reported in 2004.
- The percentage of employed graduates working in New Brunswick decreased to 89% from the 91% reported in 2004.
- The percentage of graduates in self-employment was 2% in 2005, one percentage point lower than reported in 2004.
- The majority of employed graduates (88%) continued to be in work situations in which they were working for one employer in the reference week.
- The economic differences between the wages of men and women continues to be evident in 2005: female graduates in full-time positions earned approximately 83% of the wages of male graduates in full-time positions, similar to that reported in 2004. Female graduates working fulltime in positions related to their training also earned 83% of the average wages of male graduates in similar positions, similar to last year's result.

Follow-up surveys with graduates of New Brunswick Community Colleges have been conducted since 1983. For the past seventeen years the survey has been conducted by telephone. The survey is conducted annually with graduates of regular and non-regular programs of the Colleges. In the 2005 survey, interviews were completed with 1,794 graduates from a total listing of 2,385 graduates of the 2004 school year for whom contact information was available.

The data supplied by these surveys provides valuable feedback on the success of New Brunswick Community College graduates in the labour market, which, in turn, serves as an important indicator of how well the training provided by the NBCC system corresponds to the demands of the labour market.

This report provides detailed information gathered from the Survey of 2004 New Brunswick Community College Graduates through five sections, which are summarized in the material, which follows.

- **Section II** presents information related to the way in which he 2005 survey was conducted and provides a profile of the graduates contacted with a comparison with the overall population of graduates.
- **Section III** presents the information highlights from the 2005 survey.
- **Section IV** presents fact sheets that report the survey information on a program-by-program basis.
- Section V presents labour market information on a program-by-program basis.
- **Section VI** presents the evaluations provided by graduates.

A list of terminology used in this report is provided in Appendix A.



The Survey of 2004 Graduates of the New Brunswick Community College (NBCC) was guided by researchers from the Labour Market Analysis Branch of the Department of Training and Employment Development (the Department). Any comments or questions about the information contained in this document should be forwarded to the Department.

In June 2005, the Department generated a database with background and current contact information for 2,385 graduates from the Class of 2004 for the NBCC. The background data and required contact information was retrieved from the Department's student information system.

Prior to the start of the survey (in June 2005), the database was reduced by three (3) graduates for whom no current telephone numbers were available. During the data collection period, some respondents were removed from the original list because they were deceased, otherwise indisposed (e.g. on holidays/unreachable for the entire fieldwork period) or not a graduate of a 2004 program. Following removal of these names from the database, and removal of the potential contacts for introductory programs, which were not included in previous surveys, there were 2,385 potential contacts for the Class of 2004. The 1,794 interviews completed represent 75% of the total number of graduates who were eligible to participate in this survey.

As in previous surveys, graduates were asked about their activities during a specific week of the year (the reference week). Reference week information is an indicator of graduates' current activities. *The reference week for the 2005 survey was June 5th – June 11th, 2005.*

In addition to the reference week information and the information collected on activities since completing their training, graduates were also asked to evaluate their NBCC training program and various facilities and services available at their college.

The overall approach to the Graduate Follow-Up Survey was changed in 1996. Previously, surveys were conducted in March, capturing information from graduates of the previous academic year. The change in the time of the reference week should be kept in mind when comparing the results from the surveys in 1996 - 2005 to those conducted in previous years. For example, the question asking respondents if they were studying during the reference week gave very different results in 1996 - 2005 compared to previous years. These differences are understandable considering that most people enrolled in post-secondary institutions would be attending classes in March but not in June.

The telephone interviews with graduates were conducted by POLLARA's Bathurst office in New Brunswick, beginning six weeks after the reference week.

The 2005 survey response rate of 75% is lower than the 80% that was achieved historically. Over the past four years, it has required additional time for data collection to achieve the desired response rate.

II METHODOLOGY

The table that follows presents a summary of response rates for the surveys over the 2001 – 2005 period.



Measuring labour market participation is a primary objective of the graduate follow-up surveys. Because of the importance of this information, an attempt was made to determine the extent to which a change in the time of the reference week (initiated in 1996) affected the results of reported labour force activity. The potential effects were initially monitored in the 1996 survey and the monitoring has continued through the current survey. The information from the current survey is presented in the table that follows. The data presented indicate that the participation rate was higher in June and the employment rate for March was slightly lower than that reported for June.

The chart which follows presents an overview of the gender distribution for graduates contacted.

Respondents by Age and Gender



The table that follows presents a comparative summary of graduates contacted in follow-up surveys over the past five years. Prior to 2000, there had been significant increases in the percentage of graduates 25 years of age or older and significant increases in the percentage of female graduates.

In 2005, the percentage of female graduates is six percentage points higher than reported in 2004, and the percentage of graduates 25 years of age or older increased by nine percentage points.

LABOUR FORCE INFORMATION

The labour force participation rate for all graduates decreased by one percentage point compared to that reported in 2004.

The 87% employment rate reported for the 2005 survey is the same as that reported in 2004.

The unemployment rate calculated for the 2005 Survey indicates that the graduates had a higher (2.9 percentage points) unemployment rate than that calculated for the province as a whole; however, the unemployment rate for graduates was lower (2.3 percentage points) than the youth unemployment rate of 14.9% (unadjusted) for June 2005.

The table that follows summarizes employment rates over 2001 - 2005 by gender. The information indicates that female graduates continue to evidence a higher employment rate, overall, than male graduates.

ADDITIONAL EDUCATION/TRAINING FOR GRADUATES

In surveys prior to 2001, graduates were asked if they were attending an education or training program at the time of survey contact. Since 2001, respondents have been asked if they were "enrolled" in a program and then asked if they were currently attending the program or waiting to start the program in the near future.

As evidenced in the table which follows, when the 2005 Survey is compared to the 2004 Survey, the level of involvement in education or training in the reference week increased by two percentage points overall.

OVERALL EMPLOYMENT FOR GRADUATES

The table which follows demonstrates the percentage of graduates with at least one month of employment in a position related to their training. Overall, graduates averaged 89% of their months employed since graduation in positions related to their training. This has increased since 2004, where an average of 75% of total months employed were related to training.

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION OF GRADUATES

In June 2005, 90% of 2004 graduates were residing in New Brunswick. This has decreased by one percentage point from the Class of 2003.

Approximately 15% of 2004 graduates had lived outside New Brunswick since graduation. Among those who had lived outside the province (n=274), the majority (64%) had left the province for employment. In 2005, 57% of those who left the province for employment prior to relocation. In 2004, 66% of those who left the province for employment had obtained employment prior to relocation.

- 15% reported that their wages were worse (12%) or much worse (3%) than those in similar positions.

GENDER DIFFERENCES IN WAGES

Each graduate survey has identified gaps between the overall wages of male and female graduates. In 2005, male graduates averaged \$652 per week in full-time positions, while female graduates in full-time positions averaged approximately 16% less at \$546 per week.

Since it has been demonstrated that males and females tend to be employed in different occupations, gaps may have been expected; however, as the table that follows demonstrates, similar wage gaps do not always exist when male and female graduates are employed in the same NOC (National Occupational Classification) classifications.

Return to School for Additional Training/Education

The 271 respondents enrolled in or attending school in the reference week provided the following reasons for their return to an education or training program:

- to upgrade existing skills (44%);
- to get a university degree (15%);
- to get a better job (12%);
- to learn a new trade (7%);
- to find employment (4%); or
- other reasons or multiple reasons (18%).

Employment Since Graduation

Ninety-seven percent (97%) of graduates from the Class of 2004 had been employed since graduation; and those employed averaged 1.7 different jobs. The percentage of graduates who have been employed since graduation has decreased by one percentage point from 2004.

Motivations for Community College Enrollment

Beginning with the 1999 survey, all graduates were asked why they had decided to pursue their training at the NBCC rather than through a university or private training program. Overall:

- 26% chose the NBCC because it was the only place which offered the type of training desired;
- 24% indicated that the NBCC offered a less expensive alternative than either a university or a private program;
- 12% based their decision on the location of a particular College;
- 8% chose the NBCC because of the shorter time requirements for completion of a program of study;
- 6% indicated that they prefer College to University;
- 6% based their selection on the reputation of the College;
- 3% cited the "hands-on" or the practical approach of the NBCC as motivations for their choice:
- 2% indicated that they had lacked the marks or other requirements for entry to a university program;
- 3% based their selection on the job prospects which would exist upon completion of an NBCC program;
- 2% indicated that they preferred the smaller clases/more personal feel that College provides; and
- 8% cited other or a combination of reasons.

When asked why they had selected a particular College for their program of study, the following reasons were cited:

- convenience of the location (47%);
- particular program was available only at the location selected (30%);
- reputation associated with the College (7%);
- language of instruction at the College (1%);
- recommendations of friends/relatives (3%);
- lower tuition costs (2%); and
- various other reasons (10%).

Ninety-four percent (94%) of graduates were accepted to the NBCC in the year in which they made their initial application.

Overall, 80% of graduates would select the same field of study, were they making the decision about enrolment today.

Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition and Credit Transfer Services

Graduates were asked questions to determine their awareness, use and evaluation of PLAR and Credit Transfer Services. The material which follows provides a summary of the information collected.

Overall:

- 62% of graduates reported that they were aware of these services; and
- 38% were not aware of these services.

When contacted in 2004, 49% of graduates reported awareness of PLAR.

Among those who were aware of these services (n=1,041):

- 64% heard about PLAR through someone at NBCC;
- 24% heard about these services through friends; and
- 12% heard about these services through other means.

Among those who were aware of these services (n=1,041):

- 63% had applied for Credit Transfer;
- 32% had applied for a Prior Learning Assessment; and
- 5% had applied for both.

Among the 272, (15% of the graduates contacted) who had applied for one or both of these services, 168 received an exemption from courses based on prior experience or prior academic work at another institution. The exemptions granted resulted in a reduction of tuition for nine graduates, a reduced course load for 135 and some other effect for 2 graduates.

The graduates who received exemptions (n=168) provided the following evaluations of the services they received:

- 61% were very satisfied with the services provided;
- 34% were satisfied:
- 4% were dissatisfied: and
- 1% was very dissatisfied.

III SURVEY HIGHLIGHTS

Peer Tutoring

Fifty-seven percent (57%) of graduates were aware of peer tutoring at the NBCC and 18% of graduates (n=162) contacted used the peer tutoring system at the college. When asked for their evaluation of the effectiveness of the assistance provided through peer tutoring:

- 49% provided a rating of excellent;
- 45% of those who used this service provided a good rating; and
- 6% indicated that peer tutoring was fair (5%) or poor (1%).

Post Program Artistic Involvement of NBCCD Graduates

Graduates of the College of Craft and Design (n=24) were asked about their post-training involvement with the arts community in New Brunswick. The material which follows provides a summary of the information collected.

- Since graduation, one (4%) of the graduates contacted had applied to the NB Arts Board or the Canada Council for funding to promote or prepare their craft. One of those who applied received an award.
- Since graduation, 48% of those contacted reported that they have contributed to the arts through exhibits, donations or in other ways.
- During the reference week, 46% of those who had completed a program through the College of Craft and Design were practising their craft or preparing for an exhibit for which they were not paid.

Terminology

NBCC

The New Brunswick Community College is a network of eleven colleges situated throughout the province of New Brunswick.

Average Weekly Earnings

Refers to the average of the gross earnings that graduates reported for the reference week. The average weekly earnings are reported for each program and for each college where the program is offered. The figures presented are based on earnings reported by graduates who indicated that their employment was either directly or indirectly related to their training.

Employed

The number of respondents who had a job during the reference week.

Employment

Defined in terms of full-time/part-time and permanent/temporary as follows:

Full-time Employment of 30 hours or more per week.

Part-time Employment of less than 30 hours per week.

Permanent Employment which has no prearranged termination date.

Temporary Employment which ends at a prearranged date.

Employment Rate

The number of employed graduates as a percentage of those in the labour force.

Employment Related to Training

Employed graduates were asked about the extent to which their employment during the reference week was related to their training program. Options presented to the respondent included directly related, indirectly related and not at all related.

Related Employment

Includes employment that graduates reported as either directly related or indirectly related to their training program. *Directly related* means that graduates were in jobs for which their training programs had been designed. *Indirectly related* means that graduates were in jobs that required at least some of the skills that were acquired during their training program.

Not at all related

Means that graduates were in jobs that did not require any of the skills that were acquired during their training program.

Graduate Population

Graduates of regular training programs of twelve weeks or more in duration and graduates of non regular training programs of twenty weeks or more in duration that terminated between January 1, and December 31, 2003.

Labour Force

In the context of this survey, Labour Force is composed of respondents who were either employed or unemployed but looking for work during the reference week.

Not in the Labour Force

Respondents who were not working and not looking for work, during the reference week.

Labour Force Participation Rate

The percentage of respondents who were actively participating in the labour force during the reference week (based on the total number of respondents).

Labour Force Survey

A monthly survey by Statistics Canada which collects labour force information from a representative sample of the working age population.

NAICS (North American Industrial Classification System)

NAICS was used to categorize the industrial sectors/industries in which graduates were employed in the reference week. Fact sheets list the top three industries for employment. If the percentage of respondents is equal across occupations, the three most closely related to the training completed are listed.

NOC (National Occupational Classification)

The National Occupational Classification was used to categorize the kind of work done by graduates. The top three responses are given. If the percentage of respondents in each occupation is equal the three that appear most relevant to the program content are listed.

Programs

Regular

Programs that operated throughout the year on a year-to-year basis. Regular training programs are funded through the departmental budgetary process. Regular training programs are listed in the annual New Brunswick Community College Calendar. (R=Regular)

Non-Regular

Programs that are offered through the New Brunswick Community College that are not part of the regular program listing in the NBCC Calendar. These programs may or may not have the same content as regular training programs of the same name. (NR=Non-Regular)

Co-Op

Cooperative Education Programs integrate periods of classroom study with periods of training in related work. Each work situation is developed and approved by the College as a suitable learning situation. Co-Op trainees are placed in productive work, receive wages and have their progress monitored by the employers and representatives of the College. (Co-Op)

Articulated

A program offered in two stages. One stage is completed at a community college, and leads to a diploma and a second is completed at a university and lead to a degree.

Reference Week

The week of June 6 - 12, 2004 served as the reference week for this survey. During the survey all graduates were asked about their activities during this week.

Response Rate

The number of respondents as a percentage of the number of graduates.

Self Employed

Someone who is working but has no employer other than her/himself.

Total Employment Since Graduation

The total number of graduates who reported that they had been employed, at some time, since completing their training at the NBCC.

Relation of Employment Since Graduation to Training

The percentage of graduates who reported that they held at least one employment positions since graduation which was either directly or indirectly related to their training program at the NBCC.
