Digital Photography

I thought I would go into digital photography because that would get me out of my darkroom. I haven't been in the darkroom for the last two or three years, because of my health. And in the 80s and 90s, I started being out of the darkroom for a year, year and a half, two years, and that was starting to eat into my time. And I'm ten years behind in my work. So I thought digital would free me from the damp, stinky basement. ...but then as I get more and more involved, I have to learn three things: get the right printer, and the seven or eight different ways of getting what I want.
