





Area 13 North of Chatham Point



The combined aggregate daily limit for Pacific Salmon is four (4) per day.


The possession limit is twice the daily limit.

When fishing for salmon, Fishers are required to use barbless hooks.

DEFINITIONS

"Hatchery marked or marked" means a fish that has a healed scar in place of the adipose, pelvic, or pectoral fin, or in place of a maxillary.





CHINOOK


January 1 to December 31	Daily limit is two (2) chinook with a minimum size limit of 62 cm.
May 1 to September 30	You may not retain chinook: In the waters of Bute Inlet from Alpha Bluff across to the opposite shore to Littleton Point across to the opposite shore at 50 49.9° west latitude and 124 51.63° north longitude.

COHO

June 1 to December 31	Daily limit is two (2) coho per day, both of which must be hatchery marked.
August 15 to September 15	Daily limit for coho salmon in Subareas 13-20 to 13-21 will be two (2) per day one (1) of which can be unmarked.
August 15 to September 15	Daily limit is two (2) per day, one of which maybe wild (unmarked): In Subarea 13-20 to 13-21 and that portion of Subarea 13-22 described as those waters in Bute Inlet from the RCA boundary sign at Littleton Point across to the opposite shore at 50 49.9° west latitude and 124 51.63° north longitude.

ALL SALMON


July 15 to September 30	Only a single-pointed hook may be used. The use of natural bait is prohibited. No person shall angle with a fishing line or downrigger line to which is attached a) a weight that is greater than 168 grams/6 ounces; or b) an attracting device that is not affixed directly to the hook (licence condition): In Subareas 13-3 and 13-5, those waters of Discovery Passage and the Campbell River inside a line true east of the fishing boundary sign at Orange Point to the middle of the channel, then southeasterly down the middle of the channel to the intersection of a line running from a boundary sign on the southern end of Hidden Harbour breakwater, then true east to Quadra Island.
July 15 to September 15	Vessels under motor power are prohibited, under regulations of the Canada Shipping Act: In Subarea 13-5, those waters bounded on the south by a line from the boat ramp on Tyee Spit 185 m east in line with Shag Rock on Quadra Island, on the north by a line from the tip of Tyee Spit 185 m east in line with April Point and on the west by a line from the low water mark between the north and south boundaries.





FINFISH CLOSURES

January 1 to December 31	The following waters will be closed to fishing for all finfish:
	Subarea 13-24 [The waters of Phillips Arm northerly of a line from Picton Point true east to the opposite shore].
June 1 to December 1	The following waters will be closed to fishing for all finfish:
	Subarea 13-34 (the waters of Salmon Bay, bounded on the north by a line from Graveyard Point to the ferry landing on the opposite shore, and on the south by the downstream side of the first bridge upstream on the Salmon River).
June 30 to October 31	The following waters will be closed to fishing for all finfish:
	In Area 13, the waters of Village Bay inside a line from a fishing boundary sign at the north entrance of Village Bay, Quadra Island, to a boundary sign at the south entrance of Village Bay.
October 1 to October 31	The following waters will be closed to fishing for all finfish: Those waters of Discovery Passage and the Campbell River inside a line true east of the fishing boundary sign at Orange Point to the middle of the channel, then southeasterly down the middle of the channel to the intersection of a line running from a boundary sign on the southern end of Hidden Harbour breakwater, then true east to Quadra Island, is closed to fishing for all finfish, except for the Campbell River Discovery Pier. The area around the Discovery Pier will remain open inside a line running true east 50 meters into Discovery Passage at the north end of the pier, then southeasterly down the Discovery Passage to the intersection of a line running true east 50 meters at the south end of the Discovery Pier.





ROCKFISH CONSERVATION AREAS

Closed to fishing for all finfish: Area 13 has 14 Rock Fish Conservation Areas and Area 15 (Subareas 15-3 to 15-6) has four Rockfish Conservation Areas (see the red shaded area of the above map).
