 - your employment income on lines 101 and 104 of your return (not including amounts from a wage-loss replacement plan) minus the amounts on lines 207, 212, 229, and 231 (if the result is negative, use "0"); and
 - your net self-employment income (not including losses) from lines 135 to 143 of your return.
- Your net family income was less than \$27,804. Net family income is the total of your net income (line 236) and your spouse's net income (line 236 of your spouse's return, or the amount it would be if your spouse completed a return).
