PURPOSE OF THE SURVEY

To obtain information on the supply of, and demand for, energy in Canada. This information serves as an (important indicator of Canadian economic performance, is used by all levels of government in establishing informed policies in the energy area and, in the case of public utilities, is used by governmental agencies to fulfil their regulatory responsibilities. The private sector likewise uses this information in the corporate decision-making process

CONFIDENTIALITY

Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from publishing any statistics which would divulge information obtained from this survey that relates to any identifiable business without the previous written consent of that business. The data reported will be treated in strict confidence, used for statistical purposes and published in aggregate form only. The confidentiality provisions of the Statistics Act are not affected by either the Access to Information Act or any other legislation.

DATA SHARING AGREEMENTS

To reduce response burden and to ensure uniform statistics, Statistics Canada has entered into data sharing agreements with various agencies and government departments for the joint collection and sharing of data from this survey. The information provided in this survey pertaining to individual respondents cannot be disclosed by the parties with which Statistics Canada has agreements.

Agreements exist under section 11 of the *Statistics Act* to share information with the statistical agencies of Nova Scotia, Quebec, Saskatchewan and Alberta regarding business establishments located or operating in their respective province. These provincial statistical agencies have been established under provincial legislation authorizing them to collect this information on their own or jointly with Statistics Canada. The provincial legislation in those four provinces also contains the same confidentiality protection and outlines similar penalties for disclosure of confidential information as the federal *Statistics Act*.

Agreements exist under Section 12 of the Statistics Act with Saskatchewan Industry and Resources and the British Columbia Ministry of Energy and Mines to share the information collected by this survey for the respective provincial jurisdiction. As well, an agreement exists with Natural Resources Canada with respect to all activities covered by this survey.

Under Section 12 of the Statistics Act you may refuse to share your information by writing the Chief Statistician and returning your letter of objection along with the completed questionnaire in the enclosed return envelope. Note that there is no right of refusal with respect to sharing the data with Saskatchewan Industry and Resources. In Saskatchewan, the information is collected under the Statistics Act and the Saskatchewan Mineral Resources Act
