In order to avoid duplication and ease the burden on respondents, Statistics Canada has entered into the following data sharing agreements concerning this survey:

Under section 11 of the Statistics Act with the statistical bureaus of Under section 11 of the *Statistics Act* with the statistical bureaus of Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and British Columbia. Statistics Canada only enters into section 11 agreements with provincial statistical agencies that have statistics acts similar to the federal act. These agencies have the authority to collect this information and the same provisions for confidentiality and penalties for disclosure of information as the Federal Statistics Act;

The agreements we have with these agencies require that they keep the information confidential and use it only for statistical and research purposes.
