Functional foods are a food or a food component that has a health benefit beyond basic nutrition. It is a food that is naturally rich in nutrients or has been fortified with nutrients. Examples include fortified cereals, omega-3 enriched eggs, and probiotic yogurt.

Nutraceuticals are products that combine a nutrient with a pharmaceutical product. They are used to prevent or treat a disease. Examples include omega-3 fatty acids for heart health and vitamin D for bone health.
