EH_STR TIME CHECK

Note: These questions are primarily from the SLID Labour Interview questionnaire for 2000. The Employment History is collected for a maximum of 6 employers, including CEIP for program group members. An employer Roster is built with Questions EH_Q01 through EH_Q15. If CEIP is listed as an employer in EH_01N, then EH_Q02D, EH_Q02P, EH_Q03, EH_Q04D, EH_Q04P, EH_Q12, EH_Q13, EH_Q13S, EH_Q14, EH_Q14S, EH_Q15 are the only questions, in this module, that should be asked in relation to the CEIP job. Some flow patterns will be determined by a variable called PPA on the sample file. This variable stands for Project Participation Agreement and it flags CEIP employment for the respondent.

Set all counters and flags to 0 (employercounter, startseason, endseason)

enrolment date should be converted to read on the screen as follows: Month, day, year. Example July 01, 2000

If all we have is a season, only the Q04 year will be compared to year of enrolment. When the job end date is confirmed to be prior to enrolment (includes don't know/refused), the employer is deleted from the roster and the interview resumes at EH_C18.

Explanation for EH_C37YR. If the YEAR of the absence startdate is BEFORE the refdte, then we want to validate it with the respondent through the soft edit. If the respondent confirms the date then the absence will be deleted.

If the YEAR of the absence is clearly after refdte then we want to ask for duration of the absence since it appears to be within scope.

If the YEAR of the absence is the same as the refdte YEAR, then we can't tell if the absence is within scope without looking at the MONTH.
