Cycle 10 Questionnaire Package

This package describes the content, methodology and sample of the tenth cycle of the General Social Survey (GSS). Copies of the questionnaires used in Cycle 10 are attached as appendices: the GSS 10-1 control form as Appendix A and the GSS 10-2 questionnaire on family as Appendix B. Since Cycle 10 uses a computer assisted telephone interviewing system (CATI), the attached documents are only presented as reference tools. Appendix C describes the flow patterns for section D of the main questionnaire showing the different paths of questioning in the section on children.

Content and Methodology

The 1995 GSS (Cycle 10) marks the first repeat of the family core content area originally covered in the 1990 GSS (Cycle 5). Although the core content is the same in both cycles, there are differences between the two surveys. For example, Cycle 10 focuses more than Cycle 5 on the respondent's family history before age 15, as well as, a detailed history of all of the respondent's children. In addition, the Cycle 10 questionnaire has two new sections: work interruptions and values and attitudes.

A GSS 10-1 control form is completed for each telephone number generated in the sample. When a private household is contacted, all household members are enumerated and basic demographic information (i.e. age and sex) is collected for everyone. The computer then randomly selects the person who is to answer the questionnaire. Proxy interviews are not permitted.

The creation of the household matrix is new to Cycle 10. Prior to Cycle 10, the GSS control form gathered information of the relationship of each household member to the selected respondent or to a reference person. In Cycle 10, the selected respondent provides the marital status for each household member and the relationship of each household member to the other household members. This will allow the 1995 GSS to construct a detailed structure of the respondent's household.

Section A is designed primarily to collect information on the respondent's family when he/she was growing up. This also includes demographic information on the respondent's mother and father (or parental substitutes). As well, this section collects data on the respondent's departure from the parental household.

Section B focuses on the respondent's brothers and sisters. Details on the type of sibling (i.e. step-, half-, adopted and birth) the respondent grew up with and the number of siblings the respondent did not grow up with are collected. Section C contains a number of questions on gender roles and the importance of relationship, marriage, children and employment.

Section D collects demographic information on all of the children the respondent has ever given birth to/fathered and/or raised. Questions are also asked concerning child custody, living arrangements and child leaving the parental home.

Section F examines the fertility intentions of respondents aged 15 to 49. Male respondents aged 50 or older are also interviewed for this section if their spouse or partner is aged 15 to 49. Section H contains a range of questions on the marriage history of the respondent. Section J repeats these questions for persons who have been involved in common-law partnerships.

Section K collects information on the respondent's perception of the current relationship, the subjects and frequency of arguments and the sufficiency of various reasons for splitting up a marriage or relationship. Section L focuses on the respondent's participation in paid and unpaid work, as well as questions on their educational background. Section M covers work interruptions during the respondent's employment history.

Section N pertains to the respondent's exposure to environmental tobacco smoke. Lastly, Section R covers the respondents' sociodemographic characteristics such as language, religion, state of health, and income, as well as some information on their spouse's or partner's activity, where applicable.

Data Collection

As in Cycles 8 and 9, data were collected by means of computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI) using CASES software. In CATI, the interviewer asks the respondent the survey questions as they appear on the screen and uses the keyboard to enter the responses into the computer system as the interview progresses. Built-in edits and fewer processing steps result in improved data quality and reduced processing time.

CATI differs from the collection method used for Cycles 1 to 7 of the GSS. Specifically, random selection of the respondent is now performed by the computer, and it is no longer necessary to use a preprinted selection label. In addition, although shown in the attached questionnaire, skips are built into CATI and do not appear on the screen.

Sample

The target population of the 1995 General Social Survey consisted of all persons aged 15 and over living in the ten provinces, except persons residing full-time in institutions. The sample population was selected through random digit dialling (RDD).

The data for this cycle were collected monthly from January 1995 to December 1995 inclusive. Collection took place in four regional offices: Halifax, Montreal, Winnipeg and Vancouver.

Responses were obtained from 10, 749 respondents, including an additional sample of 1,250 respondents in the province of Quebec. This second sample was added primarily to improve estimates of the population in Quebec and was done on a cost recovery basis. Statistics Canada's head office selected the telephone numbers, which were then sent to the regional offices. The response rate for Cycle 10 was 81.1%.

APPENDIX C

Flow Pattern for Section D (Children)

1995 GSS

Summary

All flow patterns for Section D are designed to provide consistent information for all types of children (i.e. birth, step, etc.) and their living arrangements.

The living arrangement of the child has been divided into three categories:

- a) full-time household status;
- b) part-time household status;
- c) non-household status;

In the 1995 GSS, adopted parents are considered in the same context as birth parents. No information is asked about the birth parent(s) of an adopted child.

The flow pattern in Section D is determined when the living arrangement is combined with the number and type of parents living in the household. For instance, if a child 15 years of age or older, has full-time household status (as determined from D38) and is living with a birth parent and the parent's partner (i.e. step-parent of the child), then information is collected about the other birth parent. This information consists of the amount of face-to-face contact the child had with the other birth parent in the past month and year, satisfaction with the amount of contact the other birth parent has with the child and financial contribution from the other birth parent for the child.

The flow pattern in Section D for part-time household status children, who are in joint/shared custody, and non-household status children less than 19 years of age are similar. Information is collected about:

- a) who the child lives with (for non-household status) or who the child lives with the rest of the time (for part-time household status) and the distance from the respondent's household;
- b) the amount of time the child spent with the respondent and with the other parent in the past month and year;
- c) frequency of telephone or letter contact with the child when the child was not living with the individual parents (for both the respondent and the other birth parent);
- d) the presence/absence of financial support for the child provided by the respondent and the child's other birth parent;
- e) satisfaction with the living arrangement of the child, financial contribution made by the respondent and the other birth parent;

When birth (adopted) children less than 15 years of age and both birth (adopted) parents reside in the household, it is assumed that the child lives in the respondent's household on a full-time basis.

Flow Pattern

1. Children entering at D38:

All living children that:

- a) were reported on the household roster and did not have both birth (adopted) parents in the household;
- b) were reported on the household roster and were listed as a step- or adopted child of the respondent;
- c) were reported on the household roster, had both birth (adopted) parents in the household and were 15 years of age or older.

2. Children entering at D39:

- a) Includes those children who entered at D38 and did not live in the respondent's household full time (i.e. non-full time status children).
- b) All living children who were not reported on the household roster.

3. Children entering at D41:

All living children who have both birth (adopted) parents listed on the household roster and whose reason for living in the respondent's household on a part-time basis was one of the following:

- a) school related reasons
- **b)** job related reasons
- c) other.

4. Children entering at D43:

All living children of the respondent who were less than 19 years of age and did not live in the respondent's household.

5. Children entering at D45A:

All living children of the respondent whose reason for living part-time in the household was because of joint/shared custody.

6. Children entering at D45B:

All children who had entered at D43 and D45A.

7. Children entering D49M/Y:

Includes all children who entered at D45B, who are not listed on the household roster and whom the respondent did not have face-to-face contact within the past 12 months.

8. Children entering at D65:

a) Includes all living step-children of the respondent.

b) Includes all birth (adopted) children less than 19 years of age who live in the respondent's household part- time and who do not live with the other birth parent the rest of the time.

9. Children entering at D68:

- a) Includes all children who entered at D65 and whose other birth parent is still alive.
- b) All living birth (adopted) children who live with the other birth parent the rest of the time.

10. Children entering at D72M/Y:

Includes all children who entered at D68 and who did not have face-to-face contact with the other parent in the past 12 months.

11. Children entering at D84M/Y:

All children 19 years of age and older who do not live in the respondent's household.

12. Children entering at D90:

- a) All birth children who are listed on the household roster and have both birth parents on the household roster.
- b) All birth children who are not listed on the household roster, are less than 19 years of age and have both birth parents on the household roster.

13. Children entering at D95M/Y:

All of the respondent's deceased children.
