Pembroke Vacancy rate continues dropping

Vacancy rates dropped for the fourth consecutive year in Pembroke, but remain high. The private apartment vacancy rate is now at 6.0 per cent, down from 7.9 per cent in October 2001. Still, October's vacancy rate was the lowest since 1996 when the vacancy rate registered at 3.6 per cent.

Persistently low mortgage rates has kept home ownership as a very affordable tenure choice for Pembroke households.

Petawawa Vacancy rate falls sharply

Petawawa's rental picture tightened throughout the year to October 2002 as the vacancy rate among private apartments fell to 7.5 per cent from 24.6 per cent in October 2001. The vacancy rate among two-bedroom units fell a particularly abrupt 25 percentage points and, at 5.3 per cent, is below the 16.8 per cent observed among one-bedroom suites.

The falling vacancy rate maintained upward pressure on Pembroke rents. The average one-bedroom private apartment rent was \$470 per month, up 3.5 per cent from last year, while the average two-bedroom private apartment rent rose 0.7 per cent to \$579 per month.

The vacancy rate decreased for both one and two-bedroom units, the only two suites with sample sizes sufficient to allow reporting. The one-bedroom rate fell more than four percentage points and the two-bedroom rate one point.

CMHC's rental market survey is conducted every year in early October and measures trends in an estimated universe of 949 rental apartments in the Pembroke area.

Despite the falling vacancy rate, average rents remain four to five per cent lower in Petawawa than in neighbouring Pembroke.

Still, falling two-bedroom vacancies prompted accelerating rent growth among these suites. The two-bedroom private apartment rent is now \$554 per month, up 4.9 per cent from October 2001. This is faster than the 3 per cent hike observed between 2000 and 2001.

CMHC's rental market survey is conducted every year in early October and measures trends in a universe of 340 rental apartments in the Petawawa area.
