Re-evaluation Decision Document

Hydramethylnon

The purpose of this Re-evaluation Decision Document (RRD) is to notify registrants, pesticide regulatory officials and the Canadian public that the re-evaluation of hydramethylnon is now complete.

The Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has determined that hydramethylnon is acceptable for continued registration provided that the proposed mitigation measures are adopted and the data requirements are addressed.

This RRD presents the regulatory decisions resulting from the re-evaluation of hydramethylnon as published in the Proposed Acceptability for Continuing Registration (PACR) document, PACR2003-11 on 24 October 2003.

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1.0 Introduction

The re-evaluation of the available information for the active ingredient hydramethylnon and its associated uses as an insecticide to kill cockroaches or ants has been completed by the PMRA.

2.0 Background

The purpose of this RRD is to notify registrants, pesticide regulatory officials and the Canadian public that the re-evaluation of hydramethylnon is now complete.

On 24 October 2003, the PMRA published <u>PACR2003-11</u>, *Re-evaluation of Hydramethylnon*, for consultation on the proposed regulatory decision for hydramethylnon. No comments were received by the PMRA concerning this PACR.

This RRD presents the regulatory decisions resulting from the re-evaluation of hydramethylnon.

3.0 Regulatory decision

The PMRA has determined that hydramethylnon is acceptable for continuing registration provided that the mitigation measures specified in the PACR are implemented.

Section 5.0 of the PACR described additional data requirements for continued registration of hydramethylnon. These have been revised below as per current re-evaluation practice.

The technical registrant of hydramethylnon is required to submit the following within 24 months of finalization of the re-evaluation decision:

- all data (as they relate to the Canadian use pattern) submitted to the USEPA in response to the data call-in prior to the reregistration in the United States and USEPA Data Evaluation Reports (DERs);
- all data (as they relate to the Canadian use pattern) that were required by the USEPA as a condition of reregistration of hydramethylnon; and

- a commitment and schedule to address Canadian requirements that are not addressed through submission of the data outlined previously. These are outlined in the PMRA's data code (DACO) tables for Use-site Category (USC) #20. The registrant is required to address the following sections of DACO tables:
 - for the TGAI: DACOs 2 through 9, inclusive
 - for the EP: DACOs 2 through 9, inclusive

The above data and additional data may be required sooner if expansion of current uses of hydramethylnon is requested.
