## Hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine

The purpose of this Re-evaluation Decision Document (RRD) is to notify registrants, pesticide regulatory officials and the Canadian public that the re-evaluation of hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-striazine is now complete.

The Pest Management Regulatory Agency (PMRA) has determined that hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-striazine is acceptable for continued registration provided that the proposed mitigation measures are adopted and the data requirements are addressed.

This RRD presents the regulatory decisions resulting from the re-evaluation of hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine as published in the Proposed Acceptability for Continuing Registration (PACR) document, PACR2004-13, on 4 June 2004.

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#### 1.0 Introduction

The re-evaluation of the available information for the active ingredient and its associated uses on synthetic rubber latex, adhesives and cutting oils has been completed by the PMRA.

### 2.0 Background

The purpose of this RRD is to notify the registrants, pesticide regulatory officials and the Canadian public that the re-evaluation of hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine is now complete.

On 4 June 2004, the PMRA published PACR2004-13, *Re-evaluation of Hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine*, for consultation on the proposed regulatory decision for hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine. No comments were received by the PMRA concerning this PACR.

This RRD presents the regulatory decisions resulting from the re-evaluation of hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine.

## 3.0 Regulatory decision

The PMRA has determined that hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine is acceptable for continuing registration provided that the mitigation measures specified in the PACR are implemented.

Section 5.0 of the PACR outlined additional data requirements for continuing registration of hexahydro-1,3,5-triethyl-s-triazine. The registrants will be informed by letter of the specific requirements and the regulatory options available to comply with this decision.
