

Definitions:

Primary: Forestry, logging and support, mining, oil and gas extraction, agriculture.

Manufacturing: Manufacturing sector. **Trade**: Wholesale trade and retail trade.

Commercial services: Utilities, construction, transportation and warehousing, information and cultural industries, finance and insurance, real estate, rental and leasing, professional, scientific and technical services, management of companies and enterprises, administrative and support, waste management and remediation services, arts, entertainment and recreation, accommodation and food services, other services (except public administration).

Non-commercial services: Educational services, health care and social assistance, public administration
