

## Provincial Amounts Transferred From Your Spouse or Common-Law Partner

Complete this schedule to **claim** a transfer of the unused part of your spouse or common-law partner's provincial amounts indicated below. **Attach a copy** of this schedule to your return.

**If your spouse or common-law partner is not filing a 2006 return, use the amounts that he or she would use on Form NS428 if filing a return.** Attach his or her information slips, but do not attach the return or schedules.

If, at the end of the year, your spouse or common-law partner was not a resident of Nova Scotia, special rules may apply. Call the Canada Revenue Agency for details.

**Age amount** (if he or she was 65 or older in 2006):

If your spouse or common-law partner's net income is \$26,284 or less, enter \$3,531.

Otherwise, enter the amount from line 5808 of his or her Form NS428.
