

his teacher's guide offers background information and ideas for classroom activities that complement the large format film Mysteries of Egypt. It contains information and activity sheets, and proposes topics for discussion and research on ancient Egypt. A glossary and a reading list complete the material. The subjects covered include geography, the environment, religion, the sciences, and the life of the pharaohs and commoners. One of the mysteries explored is the death of the boy king Tutankhamun.

Teachers are encouraged to adapt the information in the guide to suit the ages and interests of their students. The emphasis is on participatory learning, and the information and activity sheets can be duplicated for use by students.


