

# Creating a Children's Book

Assessment Criteria for the National Library of Canada's *Page by Page: Creating a Children's Book*Website

**Program Area:** Language, Writing

**Criterion:** The Writing Process: Pre-Writing

### **Attainment Descriptors:**

- Uses each of the suggested strategies for generating at least five original story ideas.
- Uses Story Web sample as guide to complete a story web; includes the literary elements of character, plot and setting.

**Program Area:** Language, Writing **Criterion:** The Writing Process: Draft

## **Attainment Descriptor:**

• Uses the Story Map in Student Worksheet 2 to create a first draft that extends and sequences ideas generated in the Pre-Writing stage.

Program Area: Language, Writing

**Criterion:** The Writing Process: Revision

#### **Attainment Descriptor:**

• Uses the Revision Checklist in Student Worksheet 4 to bring about evident changes related to content, style and organization.

**Program Area:** Language, Writing **Criterion:** The Writing Process: Editing

## **Attainment Descriptor:**

• Collaborates with peers, teacher and one other adult in order to proofread and correct final draft (focus on grammar, punctuation, spelling).

**Program Area:** Language, Reading

**Criterion:** Oral Reading **Attainment Descriptors:** 

- Reads published text to an exterior audience (other class).
- Obtains feedback from audience (related to both text and oral reading).
- Uses feedback from audience to self-assess (report strengths and suggest areas of improvement to the teacher) oral reading performance.

**Criterion:** Cooperative Small-Group Work

#### **Attainment Descriptors:**

• Invites other group members to contribute.

- Contributes to a focussed discussion related to design elements in the illustrations of a variety of children's picture books.
- Selects materials, focuses on elements of design, and applies techniques to achieve stated effects in illustrations.
- Uses feedback from audience in order to assess and report on the achievement of desired effect.
