TABLE 3 Label elements required by GHS compared to CCCR, 2001

General Label Information*

Product Identifier	Required by CP&L** (Product Identity)	
Supplier Identifier	Required by CP&L** (Dealer's Name and principal place of business)	
Hazardous Ingredients	Part of First Aid Statement Contains (name of hazardous ingredients in descending order of proportion).	
Hazard Pictogram - standardized	Hazard Symbol - standardized	
Hazard Statement - standardized	Primary Hazard Statement - standardized Specific Hazard Statement - standardized	
Signal Word - standardized	Signal Word - standardized	
Precautionary Information	Negative Instructions - standardized Positive Instructions - standardized First Aid Statement -standardized

- ** The product identifier and supplier identifier are already requirements of the *Consumer Packaging and Labelling Act and Regulations* which is administered by Industry Canada.
