Precautionary Information	Keep out of reach of children On secondary display panel: Precautions; First Aid Instructions ²

¹ Under PCPA 2002, the active ingredient and any components (formulants and contaminants) of health or environmental concern that are identified on a Health Canada list are excluded from the definition of confidential business information. The regulations could therefore require that these components be listed on the label of a pest control product.

² Other information required on secondary display panel: Directions for use; Disposal; Toxicological Information; Notice to User; Notice to Buyer
