Establishing the Canada Public Safety Information Network - Strategic Information Sharing Risks



- Public concern regarding treatment of personal information managed in electronic format – *privacy is key concern for public security data-sharing*
- Integrity of the information used for public safety decisions

Balancing Expectations: Individual Privacy vs State's Duty to Protect its Citizens



- Privacy Impact Assessments conducted for CPSIN components, starting with National Criminal Justice Index-Release 1
- Regulatory (legal and policy) framework to support CPSIN information-sharing, if required
- Mechanisms to support continuing dialogue with Canadians
- National *Framework for Managing Information in Canadian Public Safety Information Network*

CPSIN – FMI and Information Sharing Standards



- Establishes common & trusted information-sharing infrastructure
- Supports privacy & information management requirements of all participating jurisdictions
- Based on international and national principles and best practices
- Components developed in partnership with all players to ensure
 - applicable to specific business
 - acceptable to all partners

Framework for Managing Criminal Justice Information



COMPONENTS ARE:

- protection of personal information (privacy)
- safeguarding information
- records management (integrity of information)
- governance, accountability, stewardship



Treasury Board Secretariat – Managing Governmental Information and the Network’s Framework for Managing Information



- Treasury Board Secretariat Framework for Managing Government Information and the CPSIN Framework for Managing Information are consistent and complementary
- CPSIN Framework for Managing Information is business-driven – adapted to needs of criminal justice community – and can be applied Canada-wide

CPSIN - Framework for Managing Information Milestones



- CPSIN – Framework for Managing Information strategy was endorsed by DM-level Integrated Justice Information Steering Committee July 2003
- *Policy and Standards* – consultations underway with Canada-wide expert working groups
