# APPLICANT DECLARATION ON LOBBYING

### **Lobbyist Registration Requirements**

*Industry Canada's Policy on Lobbyists and Contingency Fees* states that no part of a contribution will be paid towards the cost of lobbyist services, and that a contribution cannot be offered to an applicant that:

- a) for the purpose of its application for financial assistance, has retained a lobbyist that is not in compliance with the *Lobbyist Registration Act*; or;
- b) has retained a lobbyist for a commission, contingency fee or any other consideration dependant upon the execution of the Agreement.

Please complete the attached *Applicant Declaration on Lobbying* form and return to FedNor as part of your application for financial assistance.

#### **Lobbyist Registration Act**

The *Lobbyist Registration Act* dictates disclosure requirements to make more information about lobbyists and what they do available to Canadians. This Act also provides for the development of a code of conduct to assure the Canadian public that lobbying is done ethically, with the highest standards and with a view to conserving and enhancing public confidence and trust in the integrity, objectivity and impartiality of government decision-making.

#### Who Must Register?

The Act requires registration as a lobbyist when an individual is:

- paid (either as an employee, or as a consultant); and,
- undertakes to communicate with a public office holder, orally or in writing, with respect to the awarding of any grant, contribution or other financial benefit by or on behalf of the Federal government, **or**;
- participates in a meeting between a public office holder and any other person with respect to the awarding of any grant, contribution or other financial benefit by or on behalf of the Federal government.

*NOTE:* There is an exclusion to the above requirement if the communication or meeting is restricted to a request for information.

"Lobbying" consists of "any oral or written communication made to a public office holder by a paid individual on behalf of any person or organization" with respect to the awarding of a grant,

contribution or any other financial benefit by or on behalf of the Federal government, except for communications which are restricted to a request for information.

**"Public office holder"** means anyone occupying a position in the federal government, such as FedNor/Industry Canada staff, Members of Parliament, Ministers and their staffs. Any person lobbying on behalf of an applicant is required to be registered pursuant to the *Lobbyists Registration Act*.

There are three categories of lobbyists:

- **Consultant lobbyists** individuals who, for pay, lobby for clients;
- **In-house lobbyists (corporate)** employees who, as a <u>significant part of their duties</u>, \* lobby for an employer that carries out commercial activities for financial gain;

• **In-house lobbyists (organizations)** - refers to not-for-profit organizations in which one or more employees lobby, and the collective time devoted to lobbying amounts to the equivalent of a <u>significant part of one employee's duties</u> (see \* above).

Some public officials are not required to register as lobbyists when they are acting in their <u>official capacity</u> (*e.g. members of provincial legislature of a province or their staff, provincial or municipal governments or their staffs, band council members or their staff)*. However, third party consultants hired by the above public officials or their organizations for the purpose of lobbying, <u>would be</u> subject to registration requirements. Industry Canada's Lobbyist Registration Branch is responsible for administering the *Lobbyist Registration Act*, including the registration of lobbyists. Lobbyists may register online at <u>http://strategis.ic.gc.ca/epic/internet/inlobbyist-lobbyiste.nsf/en/h\_nx00008e.html</u> free of charge. There is an approximate 24-hour turnaround for registration approval. A toll-free number (1-800-328-6189) is available to help lobbyists with first-time registrations. Lobbyists who do not have access to the Internet may request a form by fax or mail. Please note that there is a fee (ranging from \$75 to \$150) for registering by paper.
