## Beyond Collision: High Integrity Labour Relations CPR Short-Line Railway Case Study

Throughout the 1980s and 1990s, major railroad companies in the United States and Canada were selling or abandoning branch lines considered peripheral to the main or core rail lines. An extensive study, jointly conducted by the unions and Canadian Pacific Railway, showed that turning branch lines into internal, semi-autonomous profit centres, or short-line railways, was viable. To attain viability, union and management agreed to dramatically change how work was done and to realize a 30% reduction in labour costs. As a result, two internal short lines, Kawartha Lakes Railway in Ontario and Kootenay Valley Railway in British Columbia, were launched in 1996 and 1997, respectively.

This case study looks at how the turnaround was achieved through the short-line study, the planning of the short-lines, the new collective agreement needed, the launch of the two short-line railways and the results and future developments.
