#### Coverage

This survey is being collected from businesses at the establishment level of organization. For this purpose, an "establishment" is defined as the lowest level of the firm for which separate records are kept for such details as revenue, expenses and employment.

"Single-establishment" firms should report data for all their activities on this report.

Other firms (generally those which are larger and more diverse) will have more complex organizational structures and record-keeping needs, and therefore may have more than one establishment. For this survey, such firms should report data for only their establishments whose principal business activity is in the computer services industry (see Section 2). It may be that these establishments engage in sideline activities outside the computer services industry; their data (e.g. revenue, expenses, employment, etc.) relating to those activities should also be reported on this form.

This report should **exclude** the revenue of your separately incorporated subsidiaries or foreign branches, but should **include** your portion of the revenue and expenses of unincorporated joint ventures in which you are involved. Please report all amounts in **Canadian dollars**.

#### Survey Obiective

The survey objective is the collection and publication of data necessary for the statistical analysis of the computer services industry.
