Functional foods have extra health benefits that go beyond their basic nutritional value. They can be natural foods like oat bran which can lower cholesterol levels, or they can be a manufactured food with an added beneficial substance. For example, a beneficial substance in soybeans can be extracted and used to make a cholesterol lowering margarine.

A **nutraceutical** is a substance with special health benefits that has been purified from a natural product, usually a food. They are sold as pills, fluids, tablets or capsules. Examples of nutraceuticals are garlic pills, liquid echinacea, elk velvet capsules, ginseng tablets, Omega 3 fish oil capsules etc.
