

CO-OPERATIVE:

- No resistance
- · Responds positively
- Willingly complies

RESISTANT:

- *Resists control
- Pulling/pushing away
- Intent of not being controlled
- ·Fails to stop
- *Evades Apprehension
- Open & angry refusal to respond to lawful commands

NON CO-OPERATIVE

- ·Little or no physical resistance
- Does not comply to officer's request
- ♦Verbal defiance
- *Refusal to leave scene
- .Failure to follow directions
- Advising others to disregard officer's lawful instructions

COMBATIVE:

The person attempts or threatens to apply force to anyone.

1E: Punching, kicking, clenching fists with intent to hurt or resists or threatens to assault. In the case of a person operating a vehicle, the person attempts or threatens to apply force using their vehicle in a manner which is not perceived as having the potential to cause grievous bodily harm or death.

LETHAL FORCE:

The person acts in a way which would the police officer to believe the actions could result in death or grievous bodily harm to the public or police.

IE: Knife attack, baseball bat, use of firearm, operating a vehicle; In the case of a person operating a vehicle, they attempt to collide or collide with the police vehicle, any other vehicle or person in a manner which is perceived as having the potential to cause grievous bodily harm or death. Weapon is not an essential element as long as fear of death or grievous bodily harm exists.

In order for police to use force to control a subject, three elements MUST exist.



Did the suspect have or reasonably appear to have the ABILITY to cause injury or death to you or others?

Did the suspect demonstrate INTENT. Did words and/or actions lead you to believe the suspect had the intent to cause injury or death to you or others?



Did the suspect have the MEANS to deliver the perceived threat?
